The week prior, May 15<sup>th</sup> through the 20<sup>th</sup>, is the inaugural EAA Learn to Fly Week where aspiring aviators will have the opportunity to discover multiple pathways to becoming a pilot.

The Emergency Aircraft Repair (EAR) information has been disseminated by Chairman Bernie Nitz. The tool committee has been working on some of the tools have been realigned and will be inventoried shortly.

The RV-12iS student-build is progressing to the point where we have pieces going together to develop a fuselage and it is starting to look like an airplane. The side skins were attached to the bulkheads. We meet every Monday and Thursday evening and Saturday morning at the North Scott Transportation Building in Eldridge, Iowa.

The Ray Scholarship Committee convened several meetings and are close to presenting the top candidates for our potential 2023 Ray Scholar.

Lastly, I would like to end with a quote from President John F. Kennedy during one of his speeches prior to the initial challenge of the United States getting involved in the space race he made this statement:

"Ask not what your country can do for you, ask what you can do for your country". At that time, his speech and challenge had a large, great impact on a lot of people in our country. Treasurer's Report: Monthly chapter business meeting was too early in the month to have completed the report. EAA sent us the final Ray Scholarship funding in March. Also, in March we submitted our Illinois non-profit registration which carries us through 2024. Our next major requirement is to complete our IRS 990-N in April. Motion to accept by Chris Welvaert, seconded by Rily Grunwald. Passed unanimously.

**Approval of Chapter Business Meeting Minutes:** A motion to approve the March minutes as published in the April newsletter was made by Chris Welvaert, and seconded by Rily Grunwald. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. 2023 Ray Scholarship Selection Process: Jim Skadal reports having a conversation with Bob Thomas about the Ray Scholarship Selection Committee. The Ray Scholarship Selection Committee has had a couple meetings. Jenny Wilson reports that she will take notes during upcoming committee meetings and share with the board of directors. The committee is still on track to provide a rank ordered list of candidates to the board of directors by May 31<sup>st</sup>.
- **2. Young Eagles:** The board discussed hosting a Pancake Breakfast at the Davenport Municipal Airport concurrent to the May 13<sup>th</sup> Young Eagles Kickoff Event. The board of directors will move forward with planning to support and finalize during next month's chapter business meeting.

- **3. Membership Renewal Update:** Liz Richards reports 52 unpaid members for 2023.
- **4. Sunshine Fund:** Chris Welvaert will develop initial guidelines for the chapter's Sunshine Fund to include membership longevity awards, criteria for lifetime membership, etc. Gregory Stopyra will ask the EAA Chapters office if there are any written guidelines from other chapters. Follow up will occur during May's chapter business meeting.
- **5. Birdies for Charity:** Chris Welvaert and Gregory Stopyra will engage with select chapter members to gauge their ability to engage local businesses with specific aviation ties to contribute to Birdies for Charity 2023.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Air Academy: Jim Skadal (as the Chapter Air Academy Advisor) reports Bob Thomas deferred the 2022 Young Eagle Credits to the board. The chapter has \$1355 in Young Eagle Credits available to apply to the Air Academy. Jim Skadal reports the chapter needs an additional \$1755 to satisfy the remaining balance for our chapter's Air Academy scholars. Chris Welvaert made a motion, seconded by Gregory Stopyra, to approve no more than \$2000 for Air Academy out of chapter operating funds. Motion Passed.
- **2. Young Eagle Build & Fly:** Jim Skadal made a motion, seconded by Liz Richards, to gain approval to purchase the EAA Young Eagles Build & Fly RC Kit from EAA HQ with the chapter's operating fund. The motion passed unanimously.
- **3. Henry Rahlf Jr.'s Dues to Son:** Gregory Stopyra made a motion, seconded by Chris Welvaert, to transfer Henry Rahlf Jr.'s membership credit to son Steven. The motion passed unanimously.
- **4. Business Donor Recognition Levels:** Gregory Stopyra highlighted how other EAA Chapters, such as EAA Chapter 179, recognize business donors in their

monthly newsletter based on yearly giving levels. Gregory Stopyra made a motion, seconded by Chris Welvaert, to recognize business donors in our chapter newsletter at the following levels: \$100 for Bronze, \$500 for Silver, \$1000 for Gold, \$5000 for Platinum, \$10,000+ for Diamond. The motion passed unanimously.

Liz Richards made a motion, seconded by Chris Welvaert, to close the meeting. The motion passed unanimously.


#### Barnstormer Boutique Grand Opening

#### **A Board Meeting Observer's Report**

Having recently listened to concerns candidly shared with me by fellow members, President Jim Skadal invited me to participate in April's Board of Directors meeting. I immediately thought this would be a good idea, since from where I stand - just a plain old member (emphasis on old), it seemed a good idea to evaluate new ideals being advanced by our well intentioned Board of Directors against the "It's not broke; let's not try to fix it" view I've gathered from more than several veteran members.

Jim introduced me during the New Business segment of the April 1<sup>st</sup> meeting. I began the lively discussion by reporting there seems to be an "us" versus "them" disparity shaping up lately, a red flag for any organization. In my view, past-elected boards seemed to operate more within the good graces of non-board members. That is, communication back and forth was consistent, Board meeting discussions reflected mem-

bers' collective concerns, & results of board decision making were generally well accepted by members. In my personal fly-on-the-wall view, this has not been the case recently and members' trust in the Board of Directors is at risk.

But, I've learned the board is striving to provide the leadership we elected them to give. Its focus is partly to actuate changing EAA Oshkosh ideals put forth in chapter leader training, and aimed toward enhancing members' experience at organized "gatherings," and partly to address the board's concerns for an apparent decline in attendance at structured chapter meetings. In response, our Board of Directors plans for a monthly gatherings shift from the business-format second Saturday evening meeting, toward a better-attendedmerged focus first Saturday morning experience. Secretary Gregory Stopyra asserts this is in line with survey feedback indicating a majority of respondents would prefer to gather on Saturday mornings than on Saturday evenings (although he also stated that survey responses have been sparsely submitted).

I'll cut to the chase, for we aired out a lot of concerns. Our Board of Directors represents us, the members. I now have a better understanding of that and I think board members do too. Anyway, the pending outcome seems to be that the first-Saturday morning experience (which remains revokable if it just doesn't work out) will quickly evolve to include refreshment & hangar-flying, plus agenda features many members miss from the no-longer-held Saturday night meetings:

- Opportunity for members to input ideas to the board
- Key activities feedback from the board and committees back to members.
- Opportunity for members to report on their projects or special flying experiences.
- Interesting and entertaining program presentations.

This comes at a cost, namely:

 The chapter is in dire need of program planning leadership outside the Board of Directors, and program content will likely be spotty until

- someone steps into that volunteer role. If anyone is able to tackle this vital role, please contact Iim
- The President strongly feels the monthly chapter gathering should take place at the airport, although this means less space (for now) and possible pre-empting of Chapter 75's Deere-Wiman Carriage House option by some other group wanting to take the Saturday night timeslot.

There was a sidebar discussion about the excellent support offered to builder-members by our Technical. Counselors. In my personal view, we have the best, most engaging group of well-qualified TC's I've ever experienced my three decades as a member. Many thanks to our whole TC team!

Thanks also to the Board of Directors for this opportunity to express, as best I've been able, members' needs and desires. If I've misrepresented anyone's personal attitudes or points-of-view, I apologize in advance.

Our Chapter 75's Flying Start event at Revv Aviation in Davenport, Iowa is on May 20<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 AM is a GO! I am happy to report great support from chapter CFIs and pilots. As of this writing, we have seven CFIs, both independents and those associated with local flight schools, pledged to be present to speak with these aspiring pilots. Additionally, we have six volunteer pilots willing to offer Eagle Flights to these interested adults. We also have four Eagles registered online who expressed interest in learning about what it takes to pursue their dreams of getting a pilot certificate.

Where you can help: We still need volunteer Eagle Pilots and hospitality team members to help make this event a success. Unlike Young Eagles, there is no online training or background check required to be an Eagle Pilot. Any certified pilot who is a member of both EAA National and Chapter 75 can volunteer. During the event pilot and Eagle passengers will sign waiver forms which will allow HQ EAA to provide an additional \$1M liability insurance for that flight. Registration is open now and closes on May 14<sup>th</sup> at midnight. There will be a cap on attendees based on the number of Eagle Pilots available to provide flights. Please spread the word by inviting an adult you feel may benefit from this event.

### **EAA Chapter 75 Receives Gold Level Status**

Editor's note: As previously mentioned from the 'President's Desk', EAA Chapter 75 was recently awarded the prestigious 'Gold Level Status' from the EAA national headquarters. Here is the letter that was presented to the chapter.

Dear Jim Skadal, President, EAA Chapter 75

Congratulations to your chapter in successfully reaching the gold level status recognition level for the 2022 year. EAA is happy to present you with a chapter recognition banner to proudly display where your chapter meets. Your level also will be displayed online at <u>EAA.org/FindAChapter</u> with a specially designed emblem. You are encouraged to use your emblem on your website, newsletter, and other promotional materials; your chapter emblem is included.



To review your chapters overall scoring, please see this document, and simply find your chapter.

This program was developed and measured in partnership with EAA's Chapter Advisory Council and is based on 10 criteria that are consistently found in active and highly engaged chapters. An additional 11th criteria point was included to enable chapters to bring forward a chapter event or program which enhances their chapter by bringing more people to engage with their chapter. Each is worth a point, and there are three levels of recognition: bronze (7 out of 11), silver (8 out of 11), and gold (at least 9 out of 11).

Below are the qualifying Chapter Recognition criteria, along with your chapter's points. A one (1) indicates that your chapter earned credit for the associated criteria.

- 1. Attends a chapter leadership training session
- 2. Growing or steady membership
- 3. Offers IMC or VMC Club programs
- 4. Participates in Young Eagle or Flying Start programs
- 5. Has EAA-approved Flight Advisor or Technical Counselor
- 6. Participates in EAA's Annual Chapter Member survey
- 7. Participates in Young Eagles Build and Fly, Young Eagles Workshops, Ray Aviation Scholarship program, or sends a youth to EAA's Air Academy
- 8. Requests an EAA ChapterBlast email
- 9. Hosts at least two public events each year
- 10. Owns/leases a facility
- 11. Extra credit activity, such as a chapter build project, youth build project, chapter scholarship, a chapter tool crib, IAC competition, etc.

EAA Chapter 75, Inc.'s 2022 Chapter Recognition total is 10 out of 11.

#### **Strange New Worlds**

"To explore strange new worlds, to seek out new life and new civilizations, to boldly go where no one has gone before." These words define the most iconic mission statement ever written, that of the Starship Enterprise. 


