Wings & Wheels History

Told by John Hermann to Chris Roenitz

Hi Chris: In response to your inquiry about the event.

Al Hoftiezer was the originator of the Wings and Wheels idea. He also headed the whole show the first couple of years. He pulled out when he became ill and then eventually died. After that, no one really stood out as head organizer, each group involved did their own thing.

Magnus tried to hold things together by designating a person in charge of organizing, Lisa Willadson did that for a couple of years. One by one the other groups pulled out until we were pretty much left holding the bag as you know. I never headed Wings and Wings, usually our part of it was headed by whoever was chapter president at the time. For two years or so, Joe Unger was president but he was not able to be around much so I filled in a Vice-President at the time. During that period we often heard comments that we never had enough airplanes in attendance and we were the aviation people. Paul Jumes of Windway suggested one time that we contact the military for aircraft displays & flyovers, he even had a letter he received from the Commander at KI Sawyer AFB.

I volunteered to look into this and found the job tougher than anticipated. I sort of had to learn the ropes on my own which involved a lot of red tape and leg work. After a couple of years I finally accomplished sort of personal goal. I was successful in arranging for a C-130, an A10, Coast Guard helicopter, National Guard chopper and Flight for Life. Believe it or not some complaints came back to me that we still weren't doing enough.

There are a lot of factors that influence who will come to our event. First it is not classified as an airshow, secondly most military units do not fly on Father's Day, and we never start early enough with planning. Most military units have their airshow schedules in place by the end of the previous year. Anyway we always had excellent cooperation from our own membership when it came to planning our part and in obtaining the needed supplies and equipment. Our chapter over the years put everything into it and really worked hard.

I hope this helps you some, as far as I know not much was written down for posterity's sake. Regards. John H.

If it's got wings or wheels, you'll find it Sunday at the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport.

Everything from old war planes, horse-drawn wagons, antique and clas-sic cars to vintage farm tractors and steam engines will be on display during Wings and Wheels.

Sheboygan County's first fly-in and drive-in is sponsored by the Sheboygan County Historical Research Center. The free event will kick off at 7 a.m., as the cars roll in and the planes touch

airport.
"We wanted things that would be of interest to a large number of people in the county," said Allen Hoftiezer, chairman of the event. "There's some-thing for everyone in the family from the youngest child to the oldest grand-

County Airport Manager Charles Mayer said not since the airport's 25th anniversary celebration in July 1987 has there been a major event held at the airport.

Mayer said Wings and Wheels could draw a crowd of 6,000 or more, depending on the weather.

He said the county is opening up the airport for the event and providing security on the grounds and traffic control in the area

"We're doing what we can to help make this an annual event out here," Mayer said.

Children will enjoy rides in a horse-drawn wagon at Wings and Wheels. Adults can look forward to seeing a replica of the "Spirit of St. Louis."

Replicas of old-time trains will be

Magnus Aviation Inc. will be offering a \$200 discount on their beginning solo flight instruction program. From Sunday until Wednesday, the program which includes the first 12 hours of instruction will cost \$699 instead of 5899

Wings and Wheels reaches new heights

Sponsors of Wings and Wheels are flying high this week as they add up the profits from last weekend's fly-in and drive-in at the Sheboygan County Airport.

Allen Hoftiezer, chairman of the event, says the Sheboygan County Historical Research Center will receive between \$8,000 and \$10,000 after all the

bills are paid.

The overall attendance is es-

timated at 20,000.

Of these 1,500 "left the ground," says Hoftiezer, underscoring the popularity of the

airplane rides.

This is the second year for Wings and Wheels, which offers a viewing gallery of antique cars, airplanes and farm equipment as well as plane rides, entertainment and food.

The idea was conceived as a project to benefit the research center in Sheboygan Falls.

Cooperating in the event were the Sheboygan Chapter 766 of the Experimental Aircraft Association and Magnus Aviation Inc.

There will definitely be a third Wings and Wheels, says Hoftiezer.

Already, June 20, 1993, is marked for the event.

Sunday's large crowd, drawn from throughout eastern Wisconsin, assured a profitable day. But, says Hoftiezer, as important as the money coming in is the information going out.

"People are beginning to find out what the research center can do for them and that's good because, no matter how much money we make, it doesn't matter if people aren't using the resources we have."

The day began with a pancake breakfast at the airport and everything was supposed to stop at 4 p.m., says Hoftiezer. "This year, people were still waiting for a plane ride at 6:30."
