



The Magic Engineering Behind Why Early Fighters Didn't Shoot Their Own Propellers






Let's dive into something that's been bugging many for decades: how did old fighter aircraft shoot at the enemy without blasting their own propellers into oblivion? Picture this: the early 20th century, the <u>First World War</u>. The airplane was the new kid on the block – and a game-changer. However, engineers were scratching their heads when it came to its use in combat, wondering, "How do we fire through the propeller without shredding it?"

Enter the interrupter gear, also known as the synchronization gear. No, it's not a fancy piece found at a steampunk convention – it's pure, refined ingenuity. Anthony Fokker, a Dutch engineer, was the man behind this unique device. He saw the problem and thought, "Nope, not on my watch."

What's so special about it, you ask? The interrupter gear was like an early tech version of playing *The Floor Is Lava*, but with bullets and propeller blades. The gear made sure an aircraft's machine gun only fired when the propeller was out of the way, meaning pilots could go full trigger-happy without the risk of turning their propellers into Swiss cheese.

What's the trick to the interrupter gear?

Here's the deal: the interrupter gear is <u>all about timing</u>. It's linked up to both the propeller and the machine gun, creating a sort of mechanical rhythm between the two. The basic idea is to make sure the gun only fires when it's safe to do so – basically when it's not going to obliterate the propeller. The propeller is spinning and each time a blade is safely out of the way, the interrupter gear lets the machine gun pop off a round. The second a blade is back in the danger zone, the gear blocks it from firing.

It's like having a buddy watching your back while you're shooting hoops, making sure you never throw the ball when someone is in the way. Your friend simply puts a hand on your shoulder to stop you from throwing whenever someone's there, keeping the game safe and fun!

This synchronized dance of machinery is what allowed early pilots to fire through their propellers without turning them into accidental kindling.



Ralph O. Helgeby EAA Chapter 77 Building Use Policy

Members are allowed to use the EAA Chapter 77 Facility in accordance with this policy ONLY.

Approval of use will be at the discretion of the EAA Chapter 77 Board of Director, on a first-come first-served basis, with EAA Chapter 77 activities ALWAYS taking precedence.

All use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility must be an acceptable use per the current insurance carrier of EAA Chapter 77.

All uses of the EAA Chapter 77 Building Must Be Approved by the EAA Chapter 77 Board in advance of the Use. Application for Facility use will to call the current president, or vice president if the president is unavailable (out of town or unresponsive for more than 48 hours) for approval. Then put the requested event on the calendar in the EAA Chapter 77 meeting room.

Use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility is restricted to the Meeting Room and Workroom ONLY; the hangar space cannot be used except by EAA Chapter 77 and those renting hangar space from EAA Chapter 77 without special Board approval.

EAA Chapter 77 use of ANY portion of the Facility shall supersede all other uses of the Facility.

All Use of the Facility will be placed on the Chapter Calendar.

Use of the Meeting Room will not exceed 75 occupants, 6.5 or 4.3 ft² per person.

Occupation of the Workroom will be approved by the Workroom Chairman in advance of occupation.

No Alcohol is allowed on EAA Chapter 77 property.

None of the Chapter Kitchen or Eating supplies shall be used; i.e. Plates, silverware, dish towels, etc. for anything other than Chapter activities.

No tape, pins or any adhesives are to be used on walls, doors, etc. when decorating or entertaining in any way. Magnets may be used on the Whiteboard. Tables, Chairs, etc. will be kept off the walls.

The used portion of the Facility shall be cleaned immediately after use, kitchen, towels, dishes, tools, floors and walls, etc.

A Donation is Expected for use of the Meeting Room and Workroom usage,

Any damage to EAA Chapter 77 property during the use will be billed to the using member.

No chemicals are to be poured down any drain or toilet in EAA77 facility. This includes paint and paint cleaning products, petroleum, grease, etc., regardless of chemical makeup of the product.
