

Info for Pilots

Coordinates 39.33'N 79.68'W RWY 12 x 30 –1850 x 50 ft, Excellent Grass Elevation 1,412 ft MSL CTAF 123.45

Note: Landing on Cheat River is not advised for brand new pilots (*I may have missed reading this part*) without grass field experiences. View some of the videos on Facebook and YouTube to familiarize yourself with the procedures.

TANMOY's Triplog

This was my longest ever flight and I had been preparing for over 2 months. I watched every Youtube video multiple times, practiced flying the approach on XPlane and Microsoft Flight SIM. Did performance calculations with all possible situations. After all the preparation, the weather forecasts turned out terrible for the weekend. We almost called off the trip, but finally some weather windows opened up, and we were off on our way.

My pilot friend Ehsan Hamtaei from Michigan Flyers joined me on the right seat, and I am still very thankful that he trusted me to take that Cherokee into one of the most challenging airfields. We raced the cold fronts and were able to get to Ohio while watching those dark clouds on our rear-view mirror (*well, kinda!*). A filling lunch at the Airport Restaurant of Carroll County (KTSO), some cheap fuel and we were ready for our final push to fly into West Virginia.

As we reached the hills, the scenery, and the weather everything was majestic and seemed to welcome us with a smile (and a tailwind on the landing runway). Flying into the valley following the river was an absolute hoot, just why I learnt to fly. After 4 switchbacks we could finally see the runway, I can do this...I can do this!!!

Phewwh!!! Did it.... Ehsan was probably already calling God as I got on the brakes and stopped us.

The next 2 days we camped, ziplined to cross the river and get beer, made friends with everyone on the field, soaked in that rain the whole of Saturday, watched some droolworthy airplanes all day, had some absolutely amazing food (cooked by other campers and the organizers). This was my first ever fly-in camping experience, and I think it beat every imagination I had.

The next one is on October 7th, who's joining me?



Did You Know...



Undaunted by the loss of the ST-1, Stout was determined to continue building all-metal airplanes. In 1922, he personally typed over 100 letters addressed to prominent businessmen asking each to pledge \$1,000 to promote aviation with only one promise, "That you will never see your money again!" Much to Stout's surprise he collected \$128,000 from influential Detroiters, including Henry Ford and his son Edsel, and formed the Stout Metal Airplane Company on Beaubien Street in Detroit. There he built the Stout 1-AS Air Sedan, an all-metal, corrugated-skin, four-place monoplane powered by a 90-horsepower Curtiss OX-5 engine. First flight took place at Selfridge Field in Mount Clemens in February 1923 with Walter Lees at the controls (seen here, with Stout at far left). The airplane was underpowered, so to improve performance, Stout switched to a 150-horsepower Hispano-Suiza engine. Stout later offered rides in the Air Sedan to promote interest in Michigan's growing aircraft industry.

Ralph O. Helgeby EAA Chapter 77 Building Use Policy

Members are allowed to use the EAA Chapter 77 Facility in accordance with this policy ONLY.

Approval of use will be at the discretion of the EAA Chapter 77 Board of Director, on a first-come first-served basis, with EAA Chapter 77 activities ALWAYS taking precedence.

All use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility must be an acceptable use per the current insurance carrier of EAA Chapter 77.

All uses of the EAA Chapter 77 Building Must Be Approved by the EAA Chapter 77 Board in advance of the Use. Application for Facility use will to call the current president, or vice president if the president is unavailable (out of town or unresponsive for more than 48 hours) for approval. Then put the requested event on the calendar in the EAA Chapter 77 meeting room.

Use of the EAA Chapter 77 Facility is restricted to the Meeting Room and Workroom ONLY; the hangar space cannot be used except by EAA Chapter 77 and those renting hangar space from EAA Chapter 77 without special Board approval.

EAA Chapter 77 use of ANY portion of the Facility shall supersede all other uses of the Facility.

All Use of the Facility will be placed on the Chapter Calendar.

Use of the Meeting Room will not exceed 75 occupants, 6.5 or 4.3 ft² per person.

Occupation of the Workroom will be approved by the Workroom Chairman in advance of occupation.

No Alcohol is allowed on EAA Chapter 77 property.

None of the Chapter Kitchen or Eating supplies shall be used; i.e. Plates, silverware, dish towels, etc. for anything other than Chapter activities.

No tape, pins or any adhesives are to be used on walls, doors, etc. when decorating or entertaining in any way. Magnets may be used on the Whiteboard. Tables, Chairs, etc. will be kept off the walls.

The used portion of the Facility shall be cleaned immediately after use, kitchen, towels, dishes, tools, floors and walls, etc.

A Donation is Expected for use of the Meeting Room and Workroom usage,

Any damage to EAA Chapter 77 property during the use will be billed to the using member.

No chemicals are to be poured down any drain or toilet in EAA77 facility. This includes paint and paint cleaning products, petroleum, grease, etc., regardless of chemical makeup of the product.
