Cliff started us off with the Pledge of Allegiance and then we got right to introductions and a big welcome to guest Jeff Willard. Jeff has lived in the area for several years and is now able and ready to rekindle his interest in aviation and the EAA. He has served as an EAA chapter president and vice president (among other positions), before moving here, and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to our chapter.

Secretary George Clarke asked that the minutes from the Feb meeting be accepted as published in the Mar Newsletter, the

request was seconded, and the measure passed with all attendees voting to approve.

Next item was the Treasurer's report by Jon Nelson. Jon reported that we had \$1,750.00+ in our checking account and \$24,780.00 in our Young Eagle savings account. Jon also reported that we had 18 dues' paid members so far for 2023.

Young Eagle Program: With Young Eagle Coordinator Larry Portouw not able to attend, Cliff presented the two pending operations on the current horizon.

The first is a group of German Exchange students visiting the area and as part of their Program their organizers would like to provide them with Young Eagle rides on either 14 or 15 Apr 2023 if our chapter can do so. So far Larry Portouw, Dan LaChance, Marvin Hurd, Dennis McMahon, Bud Frazee, Cliff Van Vleet (if his aircraft's annual can be finished in time), and Angelo Petropolis (if his annual has not started) have volunteered. The Exchange Program, in appreciation, has offered to donate \$400.00 to our chapter's general fund.

The second group is another batch of Veritas students provided by Rick Tutor. A tentative date of 6 May 2023 has been suggested but awaits final school approval. (Postponed -ed.) Rick anticipates around 25 children. We need pilot volunteers for this event.

Joe Spurgeon, our Airport Commission representative, reports that under the new guidelines from our new mayor, our airport will now be represented by one individual (to be determined) at City Council meetings as part of the Transportation Committee's input.

Cliff reminded us that today and tomorrow is the Great Davis Monthan Airshow, and that this coming week is the Sun 'n Fun EAA Fly-in in Florida.

After a brief discussion it was decided to hold the next chapter meeting at 0900 22 Apr 2023 at the City terminal, and the meeting was adjourned.
