





CHAPTER AVIATION SCHOLARSHIPS 2018

Crystal Lake EAA Chapter 790 is offering scholarships for Youth in Aviation. One is a \$1,000 scholarship paid directly to a certified flight training facility, the other is an Aviation Camp in Oshkosh, Wisconsin EAA Air Academy in June or July 2019.

Applicants for the \$1,000 scholarship submit a written one page essay on why they are interested in Aviation and their Aviation objectives. A Chapter 790 Scholarship committee will review the essays and inform the lucky winners. You must be 16 to 20 years of age and with the consent of a parent or guardian. It must be typed double spaced using 12-point font. Please have at least 3 paragraphs to your paper; introduction, body and conclusion. Use focus and any relevant evidence to support your ideas. Use conventional standard written English. Ideal candidates should be well rounded, have a high school GPA of at least 2.00 on a 4.0 scale, be involved in school and community activities, as well as have a proven interest in aviation.

Please provide 2 references along with your paper.

Applicants for the **Aviation Camp** ages 12-15, please provide name, address, age, parents or guardians name and phone number, child's interests and the child's reason for wanting to attend the Air Academy. The winners will be awarded their scholarship at the Annual Chapter Banquet in February, 2019

June Board Meeting minutes were approved.

Treasurers Report: Tom LeGates

Current Chapter Balance is \$8,282; last year's balance at this time was \$7,200

Paid Membership; 40

Pancake Breakfast summary: 535 paid, 39 free support personnel

60 Aircraft flew in verse last year's 13

Net Income \$3,375.29

A bag of Cleco's was donated to the chapter

Lon mentioned we could use more chapter volunteers

next year. We were a bit thin this year.

Secretaries Report: Tom Solar

Printer Ink Cartridges were purchased for those who receive the mailed Newsletter.

Young Eagles: Matt Van Bergen

Young Eagles credits are obtained for the current year by February of the following year. Credits must then be used within that following year.

Tim Lynn and Paul Galluzzo will be flying Young Eagles in the Jet Ranger Helicopter in Sept. Their Helo was down in August for Annual inspection. Tom LeGates commented that EAA only allows 3 passengers per Flight for their insurance requirements. *Matt confirmed with EAA only three per flight.* The Jet Ranger can take four or more passengers.

Board members asked how Tim got involved. While George Roby was marshalling one day, Tim was at the airport and asked what was the event. When informed he asked if he too could fly YE's. Tim signed up, took the EAA YE test and was accepted as a YE pilot. Thanks George and Tim.

It was determined that yard signs would not be put out for future YE events. This was a lot of work and per attendees was not instrumental in YE attendance. The LITH YE sign will continue to be placed as well as LITH Village Marquee requested. Paul reported that 90% of YE's are repeats. The Newspaper is the largest contributor to YE attendance. Matt keeps a list of YE's flown and sends out emails to them prior to each event.

Discussions evolved around CAP attendance and instruction. Ole gave a demonstration of proper baton signals. Request was made that the CAP see our YE Chairman 30 minutes prior to YE event for training on CAP YE duties. Any CAP issues should be brought to the YE Chairman by the CAP leader for determination of proper YE responsibilities. Paul will assist in CAP leadership instructions.

Young Eagles times were reported by Tom LeGates that are contradictory on the Chapter's Website. Paul determined only one time should be stated and that was begin at 8:30 AM. *Tom made the respective change on the website*.

Scholarships: Paul Ranieri

The board approved both a \$1,000 scholarship for flight training and an Air Academy candidate. Since there are three Academies, Tom Solar agreed to research and send the information to the board in order to choose which Academy to present. The email was submitted to the board for their review and reply.
