## DECEMBER FLY OUT

"Ramp Fees" have become common as a means of generating revenues when visiting pilot opt not to buy gas. We have to realize that in many cases the FBO's major source of revenue is fuel purchases, and if we do not buy some gas there, we will encourage them to start charging "Ramp Fees". So – do buy at least some gas at the fly-out destinations.




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
