EAA's Young Eagles Program has come a long way and now offers a program that provides statistics on the kids that we flew and the volunteer pilots that provided them a flight. Thanks to Ted and Chuck at the registration desk for the quick turn-around on providing that information just hours after the event ended.

This was my second time serving as a Young Eagles Volunteer Pilot and because I was now familiar with how the event is orchestrated, I thought I would try a few changes focused on messaging. Unlike my first time serving as volunteer pilot, I made a greater effort to communicate three key points to the parent of the Young Eagle. First, if a parent was available, I asked if they would like a photo of their child at the controls while in the air. Since I was flying open doors, I encourage Young Eagles not to take photos during the flight at the risk of dropping their phone. Three of the five indicated that they would gladly accept a photo, so I had few business cards with a simple message printed on it (Thank you for flying with us today!) and my phone number. I left it up to them to contact me for the photo. Secondly, I let them know that the entire event was put together by volunteer chapter members which included pilots offering up their own aircraft to provide the child-centric experience. In closing, I reminded them that the Young Eagles event is intended to be a gateway to other aviation opportunities provided by EAA. Those opportunities being Air Academy, GirlVenture and lastly internships and scholarships.

While I only gave five of these "elevator pitches," perhaps an interested parent will remember the key points when they share the photo of their child taking a Young Eagles flight in a J-3 Piper Cub.
