Pure [Lake] Michigan

Lake Michigan and its incredible coastline provides the backdrop for my favorite part of going to Oshkosh—i.e., getting there and back. We can fly over land, water, or some combination of both. This year I chose the northern route on the way to AirVenture, flying past Mackinac Island and around the northern coastline of Lake Michigan, and the southern route through Chicago on the way home, flying VFR to see the sights below a low ceiling both ways. The northern route added almost two hours to my trip (the headwind didn't help), but it was worth every second.

I flew the famed Chicago VFR Flyway on the way home. Flight following was not available until I was close to Chicago, and I was surprised how willing the controllers were to take me on. In fact, Chicago Bravo wins the award as the friendliest controllers of the entire journey, both ways. I saved custom waypoints in Foreflight, superimposed over the flyway map so that I could instantly populate my GTN and set altitude restrictions to adhere to the flyway. The view was stunning below the peaks of the tallest buildings and out over the water enough to enjoy the cityscape.
