Highflights guest wifi supported our internet connection and generously allowed us to use their training room for a Ground School by Phil. Thanks also to Robin Kriley and Margot McGeary and Marsha Hood for their food shopping, preparation and serving of our guests. Previous Meeting Minutes: The minutes of the prior boarding meetings taking place on April 20th, 2021 were reviewed by all members. Motion to accept minutes was put forth by Dan Hood. Seconded Todd Springer.

Treasurer's Report: The following report of chapter finances was presented. Motion to accept was put forth by Phil Kriley and seconded by Josselyn Slagle.

Business: The following items were discussed:

- Congratulations: Charles Potts on your Charles E. Taylor award.
- Dues: all members are paid.
- Young Eagles: Double credit for young eagle flights taking place in June, July and August.
- <u>Air Academy</u>: The \$200 deposit we paid to hold the Air Academy spot was returned to us. Air Academy will be accepting 1 person for each chapter for each age group for summer 2022. If Mr. Jordan is going, we will need to reapply as soon as the application opens and consider others for sending as well.
- <u>Chapter Storage Room:</u> Transport cart for tables and chairs has been completed. Bins will need to be reconciled, organized and labeled in May/ June.
- Door Signage: Received from IBIS: 2 at \$50 T. Merklin donation. This sign has been placed in the storeroom.
- <u>Boy Scout Event:</u> Event on October 9th. Boy Scouts have asked for 2-3 chapter pilots and planes to be present for scouts during a weekend camping expedition at the airport.
- Young Eagles Event (Saturday June 12th, 10:00 A.M.-02:00 P.M.):
 - Pilots: insurance certificate has been received; we have 5 pilots going forward
 - Event health and safety: prepackaged breakfast and lunch type snacks, hot dogs, coffee and drinks
 - Use of hangar: coordinating with high flight, KBTP for Porta Johns, etc
 - Chief pilot: will be Frank Szczerba
 - <u>Registration desk:</u> Minimum of 2 should be YPP current and compatible to printer and PC or paper forms and certificates depending on method chosen. We will be using both online and paper forms for the process.
 - Gate Manager: needed still
 - Registration software: Both methods will be used paper and online software
 - <u>Advertise</u>: With butler eagles, EAA event calendar, chapter blast, Facebook, and flyers will be distributed via email soon to put at local airports
 - Ground school: toning back but not eliminating completely will be done by Phil Kriley
 - Aircraft marshal: will be Josselyn Slagle
 - Young Eagles Marshalls: escort for Young Eagles and parents (crowd control)
 - Groceries: purchase supplies after we inventory, condiment packets and no self-serve
 - Cash Box: safe money handling
 - Set up and Cleaning: Disinfect all chairs and tables, periodic wipe down, must start 07:30 A.M.
 - Tear Down and Cleaning: Disinfect all chairs, tables and equipment prior to storage

WESTMORELAND COUNTY AIRSHOW



On a dreary Memorial Day Weekend, the Westmoreland County Airshow returned to the Arnold Palmer Regional Airport in Latrobe PA. The US Navy's Blue Angels were the featured attraction. Seen at the left are the Blue Angels in Diamond formation immediately after takeoff as they came around from the left to cross the runway at midfield. This was directly over our heads!

My Grandson Ben and I had gone to the show on Sunday, after the performance had been canceled on Saturday due to weather.

At the right is the Solo aircraft #6 accelerating down the runway centerline after his takeoff roll. In just a moment he will pitch up to climb into that overcast.

The show format had the public attend and stay with their vehicles, so there was little





if any static display to see. Cars were parked facing the flight line. We were the second row back from the fence with pickups and SUVs in front of us, so some images are heavily cropped to eliminate offending hatch covers and rooflines! At right is the Dirty Diamond formation with gear and tail-



hooks down.

With the humidity in the air there were some great displays of vapor to be seen such as with this solo Blue Angel in a banana pass in front of our location. This was one of the Blue Angels first performances in their new F-18E Super Hornets. I had hoped to see the new C-130 Hercules fly but they did not perform.

Towards the end of the Blue Angels display routine the two solo pilots form up on the four other aircraft into a delta formation for the final passes in front of the crowd. Ultimately the lead #1 Boss will pull up in a break followed by the others in turn to land at the airport





Other performers included this classic P51D "Quicksilver" which flew with the F4U Corsair "Korean War Hero", flown by Jim Tobul.

The F-22 Raptor Demo Team also were present representing our current military aircraft. Again, checkout the vapor condensation during this pass at the right.





A C-17 also represented the Air Force and made this pass of the field prior to the Blue Angel's performance.



INTERNATIONAL YOUNG EAGLES DAY



EAA 857 held their first Young Eagle Rally for EAA's International Young Eagle Day on June 12, 2021. Parents and Kids began to arrive before 10 but the ceiling at KBTP was well below minimums at 300 feet. Gradually over the next two hours the fog burned off and the clouds began to lift!

The day gradually brightened, the kids attended a Ground School session with Phil Kriley, and folks enjoyed pastries hot dogs and snacks while we waited for the weather.





Our pilots from Zelie had arrived, and our fleet for the day consisted of a PA-32, 2 PA-28s, a 172 and for the first time an AR-1 Autogyro! Frank Szczerba conducted the pilot briefing and flights began shortly after noon.







As the ceiling lifted and the clouds broke to reveal blue sky, our contingent of parents and prospective Young Eagles who had waited patiently looked forward to their flights lined up anxious to take to the air! All told we had 36 registrations, and flew 33 kids and several parents for their Young Eagle rides towards Lake Arthur.
