MOBILE SIGN TRAILER MANAGER

The chapter has two mobile sign trailers (a donation to the chapter under our non-profit status). Renting them to local businesses and organizations is a potential source of chapter income.

A person (or persons) is needed to organize and direct this effort, and will include advertizing, establishing a rental price, setting up contracts with renters, monitoring condition of the trailers, and general supervision of the program. We also need to be sure we are in compliance with any regulations regarding rentals of such equipment, and insurance.

Assign a value to each item and record storage location, condition, notes about future replacements needed, make recommendations for acquisitions, etc. Update as new assets are acquired or disposed.

PULL TO PUSH, PUSH TO PULL


Or, "How I 'Field Engineered' a control device on a Cabin Heat Box for a Sonex." by Wayne Flury

What?!

I want my Sonex to have cabin heat available. I don't plan to do much "winter" flying, but on cooler days I want to be able to pull on a control knob and have deliciously warm air flow into the cabin. Or, at least I want to <u>believe</u> that I'll get warm air flowing into the cabin. It remains to be seen if the temperature in the cabin will actually in any way be affected.

I ordered a custom heat muff to install over the single final exhaust pipe (the exhaust system that came with my engine is a "4-into-1" system) and a cabin heat box to mount on the firewall. The heat box has a lever operated flap valve to divert warm air either into the cabin or dump it overboard when cabin heat is not desired. I'll use 2" SCAT tubing to connect the heat muff to the box.

However, the placement and direction of movement for the lever on the heat box was not compatible with the restricted location choices for



mounting the heat box on the firewall (particularly true for the tailwheel version of a Sonex because of the construction of the engine/landing gear mount). To install a standard cabin heat box with the exit on the bottom would necessitate routing the operating cable down under the heat box and then back up to the operating lever. That would require an extra long control cable and a complex routing of the cable with a relatively tight bend to make the final connection to the heat box.



The addition of this device allows me to "pull" a knob on the instrument panel (the knob is one end of a wire which is connected to the reversing linkage) which then "pushes" the cabin heat box valve from its "Closed" to "Open" position. Vise versa when pushing the knob on the control cable to shut off the heat.

Contact me if you would like more info on how this was made.

Note: if you ever have to make large diameter holes in stainless steel firewall material (in my case, 2" dia.), I can tell you how I did it, but there aren't any easy methods. And please, don't ask me to help you with the labor!

My solution was to add a "reversing linkage" as shown on the photo. I didn't invent this – it's a simple linkage design for problem solutions on many applications – but by the time I figured out the correct length of the linkage pieces and proper location of the mounting bracket, I was ready to claim to at least be an engineering technician! It was really mostly eyeball engineering plus trial and error (lots of trial and many errors). Hey, building an airplane is touted as an "educational" experience, right?

THE FUNNIES by Wayne Flury




Roger was befuddled. Did his psychiatrist say he should *exorcise* or *exercise* his demons?
