### MINUTES OF MEETING – February 14, 2015 Chapter Secretary: Wayne Flury

**Chapter Flying Hours:** Chapter President Greg Thomes opened the meeting with a discussion on a way to track flying hours of members, and to encourage members to fly more. He circulated a "sign-up sheet" on which members write their name and hours flown in the last month (including model aircraft time). At the end of the meeting he reported a total of 12 hours and marked that on a chart which will be updated monthly.

**Secretary Report and Treasurer's Report:** both approved as printed in the last newsletter. See the January Treasurer's report at the end of these minutes.

**January Chapter Party:** The switch from a chapter party with a gift exchange to one with a guest speaker was well received, and this should be done again next year. The restaurant facility/meeting room in Maple Lake was OK, but there were some concerns about the service and their ability to serve a large group within a reasonable time. This needs to be looked at again before the next party.

**Bill Mavencamp, Sr. Memorial:** Discussion about ideas to memorialize Bill, Sr. A consensus was to investigate naming the Maple Lake Airport after him. Glen Morrow will check with the city about procedure. Committee to consist of Glen, Pete Radintz and Steve Panuska; report at March meeting. Will need to check with the family also.

**Thumb Drive Purchase:** Tom Rammel is authorized to spend up to \$50 to purchase a thumb drive (or drives) for the purpose of downloading the EAA Chapter videos. Not everyone has an internet service fast enough to allow reasonable downloads to their individual computers. Chapter members will then be able to borrow the drives and view videos as their time allows.

**Boy Scout Camporee at Buffalo:** Greg Thomes reviewed this Boy Scout event, scheduled for May 29 – 31. The chapter has been asked to have our flight simulator available.

Buffalo Fly-In: Scheduled for June 7. Greg Thomes will meet with Mike Wiskus to discuss.

Maple Lake Fly-In: Discussed if we should hold our fly-in on same day as the Maple Lake Gear-Head Get

Together as we did last summer. Gear Head ate this year is Saturday, August 15, 2015. Voted to approve. Wayne Flury will begin submitting notices to various Calendars of Events. Need to identify a chairperson of the overall event. Kent Peterson chaired the Craft Show last year but is looking for another person to step forward and lead that event for 2015. Anyone interested should contact Kent.

**Chapter 878 Video:** Ken Compton has put together a video featuring EAA Chapter 878 from our 2014 fly-in. Discussed about posting to chapter website. Elaine Morrow was not available to question if this was

**Flight Simulator Project:** Tom Rammel has designed and drawn a portable enclosure/stand for the simulator components. Approved for him to not to exceed \$100 for purchase of plywood and other materials. Dick Burns to assist.

**Chapter Airplane Build Project:** Tom Rammel discussed the possibility of the chapter building an airplane. The purpose is many-fold, including building interest in the chapter, learning skills, and involving kids in aviation. Discussed that this may need to be a sub-group of the chapter. Biggest concern is over having a

Jason Erickson).

Dues are \$10 per year for members up to 35 years of age, \$25 per year, age 35 and over.


