
The study concluded that, when faced with common perils, people in social networks delay making decisions that would save lives and protect others from harm. Interesting!

- **CHAPTER 878 MEMBER CONDUCTING SUMMER AVIATION CLASSES FOR YOUTH IN BUFFALO**

(Ed. Note: Jon is a relatively new Chapter 878 member who is taking a strong lead on reaching out to the next generations in support of aviation as a career field through these community education programs. The classes will already have started or be completed by the time you get this newsletter, but it's good to know what our members are doing.)

The classes offered are basic introduction to aviation. I will cover topics such as aerodynamics, navigation, weather, and air traffic control. I have 2 separate classes scheduled, split up depending on age. In the class with the older age group I will include a section about careers in the field. Classes will be held July 6 – 9.

My background is: I have a Bachelor's degree in aeronautics with a major in commercial aviation and a minor in meteorology. I have my ATP and CFI-I. I've spent 2 years flight instructing and have been flying for the airlines for the past 4.5 years.

The following are the course descriptions from the Buffalo Summer Catalog:

Intro to Aviation I (Ages 8-12)

Come gain an inside look at the world of aviation! Students will receive a basic introduction to how airplanes fly, how they navigate, and how weather affects them. You will also learn about local aviation opportunities, including how to receive a free airplane ride! The final day of class will be held at the Buffalo airport where you will have the opportunity to inspect an airplane as well as tour the airport.

Intro to Aviation II (Ages 13-17)

Come get an insider's look at the world of aviation! We will learn about aerodynamics, navigation, weather, and air traffic control, as well as, talk about various career opportunities in the field of aviation - even local opportunities. Learn how to receive a free airplane ride and a free flight lesson! The final day of class will be held at the Buffalo airport where you will be able to inspect an airplane and tour the airport.

On June 3 a proposal was presented at the meeting of the Maple Lake Airport Advisory Committee for Chapter 878 to tear down the current hangar (Hangar C-5) owned by the chapter and replace it with new construction in the currently open grassy area behind the old Wright Aero hangar. After discussion it was approved and was forwarded to the Maple Lake City Council for approval or possible amendments.

Our proposal is currently tabled until the City of Maple Lake receives and approves the result of report from an engineering firm (TKDA) which is working on a project for the Airport regarding potential Layout Plans and a Master Plan for the airport.

Got A Favorite Memory? Share It With Your Chapter Family

No one responded to my invitation in the June newsletter to share a favorite photo of theirs about a memorable Oshkosh trip (or other fly-in event), so this article will again feature a memory of mine.

In 1977 Joyce and I were living in Combined Locks, Wisconsin (near Appleton). I was vaguely aware of EAA and decided to drive down to Oshkosh on a Saturday to check out the big fly-in being held there (in 1977 the convention ran from “Saturday to Saturday”). I don’t remember if I was there on the first or the second Saturday of the event, but I do recall that it was a very HOT day!

The convention grounds were much smaller back then, but even so it was still a “kid in a candy store” array of delectable aviation treats. I walked and looked and walked and looked and walked...even back then it was too much to see in one day! I had paid a “general admission” entrance fee to the grounds, and even though the vendor and commercial displays, forums tents and attractions were great, I discovered there was another part of this world that I couldn’t access. At that time access to the “flightline” was restricted to EAA members, and that area was separated from me by “corn crib” fencing and a security guard at the various gates. Not being able to wander among the aircraft parked on the flightline was more than I could stand, and it didn’t take me long to find a “Join EAA” booth!

So that’s how I became an EAA member. The next few years were hit-or-miss on attending the Oshkosh fly-in (changed jobs, moved back to Minnesota, changed jobs again, moved, etc., etc.), but my interest and desire to return to Oshkosh never left. In the mid-1980’s I started to be able to plan an annual “pilgrimage” to Oshkosh. It didn’t always happen every year...but most years. I began to get more of an idea of how broadly this event attracted visitors when, while driving I-94 east of

Minneapolis/St. Paul and through Wisconsin toward Oshkosh, I would see vehicles with a sign in a window proclaiming “Oshkosh Bound!” Ahhh...there goes a brother or sister in aviation!

I returned home that evening – hot, tired, and sweaty with sore feet, but as an *EAA member*. Joyce and our kids were already at a neighbor’s house. I walked over to join them, pulled my wallet out of my back pocket, and jumped fully clothed into the neighbor’s swimming pool! It was the end of a great day and the beginning of a long aviation adventure.

As the days of July count down toward what would have been the beginning of AirVenture Oshkosh 2020, it’s easy to become lost in “withdrawal” for what would have been the 51st annual convention held in Oshkosh, and the 68th overall. But now it’s also a time to become re-engaged and enthused for the 2021 event. I can hardly wait!
