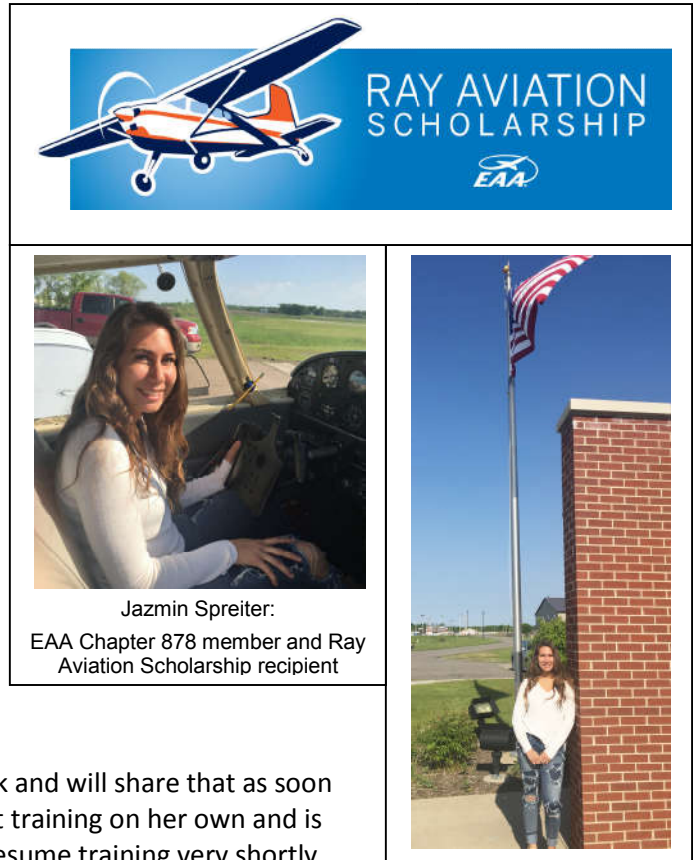

This is exciting and rewarding news, not only for Jazmin but also me! Now I won't have to be chewing my fingernails while waiting for the process to be completed.

As many chapter members as possible will need to help her in order for her to succeed. Give her encouragement, take her for a flight in your plane (maybe to a pancake breakfast or just a sightseeing flight!). We have a good group and I think this will go well.

I should have the official announcement next week and will share that as soon as it's available. Jazmin had previously begun flight training on her own and is now, with the benefit of this award, prepared to resume training very shortly.

Jazmin and I have been invited to attend AirVenture 2019 to participate in a special reception for Ray Scholars and Scholarship Coordinators.

NOTE: This scholarship program is separate and distinct from the Chapter 878 Scholarship Program. The Ray Foundation Scholarship is funded by the Ray Foundation of Naples, Florida which has provided \$1 million to EAA to fund the Ray Aviation Scholarships. Approved chapters and candidates are eligible for a scholarship worth up to \$10,000 for flight training.
