Directions to Wayne Flury's home: for your GPS, tablet or smartphone: 7803 20th St. SE, Buffalo, MN 55313. Or, call 763-670-6021.

From Buffalo: Hwy 55 east, past the airport, left on County Rd. 33. Stay on CR 33 for approximately 6.1 miles to 20th St. SE; turn left (east), go approximately 0.3 miles, destination on right.

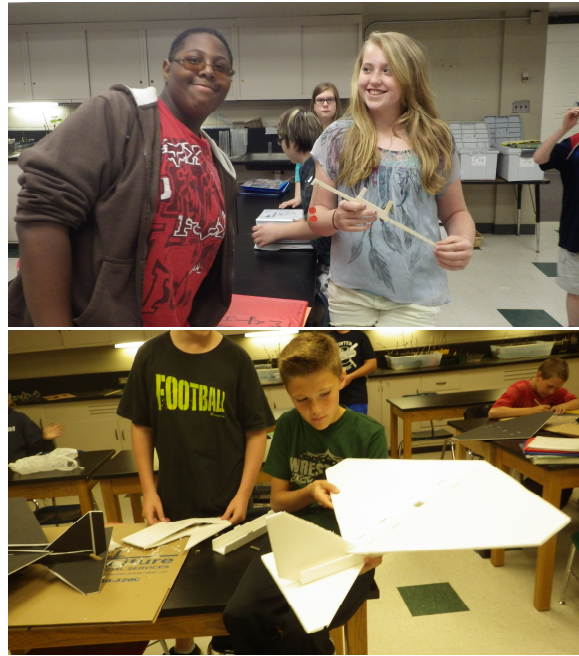
From Rockford: from intersection of Hwy 55 and Main St./County Rd 20 (BankWest is on this corner), go north 4 blocks, left at 4-way stop onto County Rd. 33. Stay on CR 33 for approximately 2.3 miles to 20th St. SE. Turn right (east), go approximately 0.3 miles, destination on right.

From Hanover: go southwest on County Rd. 20 (follows the Crow River) approximately 3.4 miles. Turn right (west) on 20th St. SE, go approximately 0.9 miles, destination on left.

Corina Sarsland, who teaches 7th grade science at the Rockford Middle School, and her son came to my home one Saturday and in 3 hours we built an RC airplane. These are the airplanes that her 7th grade class is building to learn about aviation. The next weekend we flew the airplane and got it trimmed to fly. One of the wheels fell off on takeoff, but the flight was good and I landed it in the grass without any damage!

Corina sent me some pictures of the kids building the airplanes and it looks like they are making good progress. School will most likely be over by the time you get this newsletter but I hope they are able to finish building and get a flight in before the end of the school year. Helping these kids get started with an aviation project like this is very rewarding and fun for both them and me. Thank you to Kurt Pennuto for getting me involved.



Somehow, between traveling to Pleasant Prairie, WI for business and working with the 7th graders, I was able to find time to build a new RC seaplane from scratch for myself. This airplane is called a Polaris and I scaled the plans up 1.6 times larger. The propeller is 12 inches and it is powered by a brushless electric motor and 80 Amp speed controller. It is 5 feet long and has a 4 foot wing span. It is my new favorite plane to fly and takes off and lands on the water beautifully. I am including a picture so that you know what it looks like.

Chapter Secretary: Wayne Flury

Secretary Report and Treasurer Report: Both approved as printed in the newsletter.

2014 Buffalo Fly-In Pancake Breakfast Committee

Report: The committee consists of Greg Thomes, Dick Burns, Pete Radintz and Tim Bond. Greg reviewed status to date and circulated a sign-up sheet for helpers.

Griddles are being borrowed from Rockford Fire Dept. Greg is coordinating with the Wright Co. Car Club regarding the show they will have on the same day on the airport grounds. Visitor car parking is limited on the airport, so most parking will be at the Civic Center, across the road. Greg is coordinating with Buffalo Chamber of Commerce for input to their website. PIC's will receive complimentary breakfast ticket. West Metro is arranging for picnic tables from the City of Buffalo. Menu will be pancakes, eggs and sausage. Greg is working with Boy Scout Troops for assistance (serving, cleaning tables, etc.). Discussion of how much to pay the scouts. Possible flat fee or percentage of net. Greg will work out a suitable agreement.

2014 EAA Chapter 878 Fly-In Planning

Committee Report: The committee consists of Kurt Pennuto, Kent Peterson, Tim Bond and Wayne Flury. Kent reported that almost all of the craft sale vendor spots have been rented and presented Dick Burns with cash for that. Kent discussed the shuttle bus pick up/drop off point on the airport. May need to adjust location, as it is an area that has been previously used for aircraft parking. Kent is looking at buying some banners (a one-time cost for item that has a several year life).

Fred Jude is heading up the food committee and getting quotes on food prices.

Harold Greseth will head up the car parking crew. Tim Bond will handle the aircraft parking crew.

Wayne Flury is handling advertising and promotion. Elaine Morrow is working on a fly-in poster.

Kent noted that we will add salads and pizza to the menu, for variety and for ease of responding to additional demand. A donation of pizza has been received from Bernatello's of Maple Lake.

Kurt Pennuto has been contacting aviation vendors for displays at the fly-in, and has contacts or commitments from: 99s, Wright Aero, West Metro Aviation, Delta Flying Club, West Side Skydivers (from Winsted), Young Eagles display, Wright Flyers RC club, and a helicopter service. Kurt is also checking into some banners for the fly-in.

Chapter Shirts: Kent Peterson had chapter shirts for distribution to those who had ordered them. Prices came out less than expected, so some persons will receive a refund, depending upon shirt size. New members, or those who did not order a shirt on the first opportunity, can order shirts through Kent.

RC Flying Event With Wright Flyers: Tom Rammel met the night before with the Wright Flyers about a cooperative event when chapter members can try their hand at flying an RC airplane. A future time and date will be worked out, most likely on a Saturday morning at the Wright Flyers Monticello flying field. The Wright Flyers may have an RC flight simulator available at the fly-in.

Rockford 7th Grade Science Class: Tom Rammel reported about he and Kurt Pennuto working with the Rockford 7th graders. Their teacher has purchased some RC airplane kits that Tom and Kurt will help these 7th graders build and fly.

Tree of Hope, 2014: Elaine Morrow noted that she is already involved with planning for this year's event, scheduled for December 6, 2014 at Maple Lake. They already have three additional hospitals requesting toys this year, so the need is great!

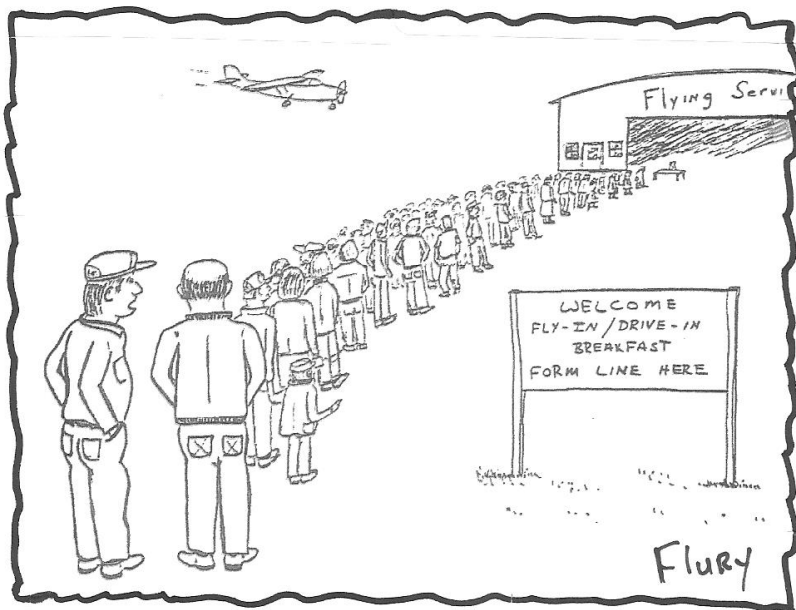
