For those driving from Maple Lake, take Co. 37 and turn south on Co. Rd 3, then turn east on 27<sup>th</sup> Street and then north on Oliver Ave. It is the fourth driveway on the right, counting the driveway at the "T" of 27<sup>th</sup> Street and Oliver. 2502 is on the mail box.


If you are coming in on Hwy 12, turn North in Cokato at the only stop light in town onto Co rd 3 go two miles and turn East on 27<sup>th</sup> street then north on Oliver Ave. It is the fourth driveway on the right counting the driveway at the "T" of 27<sup>th</sup> street and Oliver. 2502 is on the mail box.

From Buffalo take Co. 35 West then south on Co. 4, then West on 25<sup>th</sup> Street around the north side of Cokato Lake, then south on Oliver Ave until you see the driveway on the left side. 2502 is on the mail box. (Some road construction signs on Co. 35 may still say that the road is closed for bridge construction but you can go around the sign because the bridge is on Co. 35 after you turn off on Co. 4, so you never get to the bridge).

I have hamburgers and brats, buns, paper plates, plastic forks, napkins and pop. Pepsi, Diet pepsi, Mountain Dew, and Diet Dr Pepper. Please feel free to bring some food to share if you want. And I also work on the pit crew as a volunteer for the KidVenture control line group at Oshkosh each year. As a pit crew volunteer I refuel and start the control line airplanes. Some years as many as 2000 kids have a chance to fly these control line model airplanes. This year I will be working the early part of the week in the mornings until noon. So stop by and say Hi.

#### MINUTES OF MEETING, June 12, 2013 Chapter Secretary: Wayne Flury

**Program Presentation:** 22 members met in the hangar of West Metro Aviation to hear Steve Schultz of Ion Aircraft discuss the history, design, development and testing of this new airplane, of which at least one of the eventual models is planned to be LSA compliant. Steve's presentation cut to the heart of what it takes to bring a new airplane idea from paper (or electrons) to reality, and it's a tougher journey than most would think. Though the company has a flying model, it was currently undergoing various design modifications or alterations, so it could not be flown to our meeting (even if the weather had been cooperative!). Ion does plan to have the aircraft at AirVenture.

Following the program presentation, Chapter President Tom Rammel introduced the June edition of the Chapter Video from EAA Oshkosh, using Steve Shultz' video projector.
