Fortunately, no one was injured and the airplane was unharmed except for the spinner. The prop is at Maxwell's shop and the hub is being checked, so the engine will not have to be torn down. #### FAAST PROGRAM FOR MARCH MEETING

The following information was distributed to local newspapers, inviting all local pilots to our safety meeting:

#### AVIATION SAFETY PROGRAM OFFERED AT BUFFALO AIRPORT

EAA Chapter 878 (a local chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association, Oshkosh, WI) is sponsoring an FAA program presentation on Saturday, March 10, 9:30 a.m. at West Metro Aviation on the Buffalo Airport. All pilots and others who are interested in learning more about aviation are invited and encouraged to attend. EAA Chapter 878 promotes aviation safety through education.

This is an FAA Safety Team (FAAST) program and will address the subject "Factors for Light Sport and Experimental aircraft accidents and suggestions on how to avoid them." The program is based on Light Sport/Experimental accident and incident data and focuses on risk areas that have been found to contribute to these events. The first half of the program will detail several operational issues that have been identified as accident causal factors along with several case studies of accidents. The second half will consist of airworthiness (maintenance) issues that have been identified as risk areas with a discussion on how to avoid them.

The program will qualify for the Wings program – everyone in attendance will get credit.
