Some Notes on Annual Inspections, And an Article on Test EFIS Systems

Hello everyone. I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather and is finally able to get up in the air. If you're feeling rusty, invite another pilot to join you, or fly with a buddy before you go solo. It really helps get you back into the flow!

I just completed my self-directed annual on my RV-7A this week and found that my brake fluid reservoir only had about 5% of the fluid remaining. So where did the fluid go? The reservoir is located in the engine compartment, but the line immediately passes thru the firewall into the cockpit. Here's a photo of the plastic fitting inside of the cockpit which leaked all the fluid into the cockpit (photo is after repair).

The brake fluid level can easily be checked when the cowling is off, otherwise it's pretty much impossible. Here is the brake reservoir (silver) at the back side of the engine compartment in the lower left of the photo. Read more > 14 min read

Can We Treat Our Sleep Disorders and Fly?

Referring back to earlier contributions, I see many references to the importance of adequate sleep to ensure sufficient wakefulness necessary for safe operation of aircraft. Most people think of obstructive sleep apnea as the quintessential sleep disorder. Indeed, it is very prevalent, but certainly not the only disorder of sleep. And for any significant difficulty with sleep or maintenance of wakefulness, do consider consultation at an accredited sleep disorder center where specialist providers can help sort out issues of diagnosis and treatment. We can also consult our preferred AME to ask about that unusual symptom we've observed in our proverbial paternal uncle. Our concern as pilots is how these difficulties affect our privileges to fly. Some disorders of sleep as well as some of their treatments will keep us grounded. So, let's examine some of these conditions and how they can be addressed in ways that will allow us to keep flying. 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
Member Spotlight by David Wendt


