MEETING MINUTES

13 June 2023

Meeting was called to order at 1901 by President Timothy Miller. There were eleven members present and one guest.

- Minutes of the May meeting were reviewed and approved as published in the newsletter.
- Ray Olson presented the Treasurer's report: after proceeds from the Fly In Breakfast were totaled, bank balance is \$3912.07, with an outstanding debit of approximately \$600 expenses for breakfast supplies.
- David Ottis has volunteered to take the position of Chapter Treasurer. Motion was made and approved to accept Dave as treasurer. Thanks to Ray Olson for his long standing duties as the Treasurer. David and Ray will work with the bank regarding signature card, and other transfer responsibilities.
- Tim gave a report on the final numbers for the Fly In Breakfast. In spite of challenging weather (800 overcast/5-7 miles vis) Ray and Mark tallied 124 adults, 15 children for gross receipts of \$1394.00.
 Participation from the community was outstanding, considering past events. We had one fly in after the ceiling raised, a Bonanza from Millard Airport in Omaha. Big thank you to those fellows!
- Thank you particularly to our ladies in the chapter. They were there for the Young Eagles event and the Fly In Breakfast. Thank you Kay Neuharth, LaRene Nahrstedt, Cindy Throener and Janel Miller for your valuable assistance.
- Randy reported that 45 young people had been flown for the Young Eagles event. Weather was generally good for this event until late in the morning when some light rain showers 'toured' the area. The raid dampened the ground and rinsed the windscreens but did not dampen spirits. Once again, thank you to all the members who volunteered in whatever capacity. These events are not possible without strong volunteer support.
- There was some discussion regarding another YE/FIB event in the fall. The discussion was tabled for a later meeting.
- The picnic tables we purchased from the Battlecreek Golf Course need some rehab. A work day will be scheduled to sand and otherwise coat each seat and table for weather protection.
- Tim let members know that he had recently passed 300 flight hours since his purchase of the Yankee just two years ago. Kudos!

The meeting was adjourned at 2020. The July meeting is scheduled for 11 July 2023. Make plans to attend, as we firm up plans for a work day to fix up the picnic tables, and discuss other chapter plans and activities. In addition to the pilots that participated, we had an outstanding ground crew that helped with the registration and organization of rides to help make for a very smooth event. Without all the help we would not have been as successful as we were. Thank you.

I would remind everyone that **EAA** is promoting **30 flights for 30 years** to celebrate **Young Eagles** 30th anniversary. Any **Young Eagles** pilot who flies 30 **Young Eagles** between August 1, 2022, and July 31, 2023, will be awarded a commemorative polo shirt. The kids that you flew during our rally last August count toward your total so several of you are pretty close. Remember, you can make flights on your own. You just need to do the paperwork and send it in. If you have questions or need forms, please contact me. I have them. Hurry, the deadline is approaching fast. It would really be nice to see several in our chapter reach the goal.

Now for the Adventures of **Dotsuwa**. I am happy to report that **Dotsuwa** and I have reached the **"30 flights for years 30"** goal. With last year's, and this year's rally plus several other individual flights we were able to do it. The really cool thing is that the flight that put me over the top was a flight with my two grandchildren. For various reasons we hadn't had the opportunity before but they were staying with us for several days so it finally worked out. I also did two other individual Young Eagles flights this month to work toward the goal.

Of course, there were several other flights this month to help with 9.3 hours this month. A couple of local flights and a flight to Yankton. Several of the chapter members, including Jerry Kohles, Mark Throener and myself did a fly-out to Hastings for their monthly burger feed. A total of 3 pilots and 4 passengers made the trip. A good time was had by all. I would be nice to try and have a few more of those types of flights so watch your email.

Dotsuwa is now down for her annual inspection. Here's hoping it is quick and painless. Until next time. Happy Flying!

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
