












December 10th, a TUESDAY, in place of our regular monthly meeting.




Most everyone at the meeting took with them something new or a better understanding of weather from an aviation viewpoint.

FAA Successfully Completes Final ADS-B Milestone

WASHINGTON – The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) completed its final implementation milestone with —Automatic Dependent Surveillance Broadcast (ADS-B), the state-of-the-art surveillance system that enables air traffic controllers to track aircraft with greater accuracy and reliability.

The last two of the 155 airports to receive ADS-B, Akron-Canton Airport and Mansfield Lahm Regional Airport, both in Ohio, became operational last month.

This brings the operational rollout of ADS-B baseline services to a successful conclusion, on schedule and within budget, well in advance of Jan. 1, 2020, the date by which aircraft flying in certain, controlled airspace must be <u>equipped</u> with the technology.

ADS-B is now operational at air traffic control facilities across the country. These include airports, Terminal Radar Approach Control Facilities, which handle busy airspace around airports, and en route facilities, which handle high altitude traffic. All are using ADS-B as the preferred source of surveillance, which provides improved situation awareness to both pilots and controllers, among many other benefits and improvements.

ADS-B also enables more accurate tracking of airplanes and airport vehicles on runways and taxiways, increasing safety and efficiency. The new system significantly improves surveillance capability in areas with geographic challenges, like mountains or over water. Airplanes equipped with ADS-B In, which is not mandated, give pilots information through cockpit displays about location in relation to other aircraft, bad weather and terrain, and temporary flight restrictions.

Chapter 961 now has an internet forum.

We hope this will be useful both for members who don't currently have an airplane and would like to take a ride with another member who does, and also for those willing to give another chapter member a ride in their aircraft.

Aviation With a Mission

<u>THE MISSION:</u> Aviation provides access to food, medicine, mail, supplies and technical support for overseas ministries.

THE PROBLEM: Mission organizations are in desperate need of additional pilot/mechanics. TO MAKE MATTERS WORSE: Many current missionary aviators are reaching retirement age. This means that mission organizations are losing a large percentage of their current work force. Mission organizations struggle to find new missionary aviators because recent graduates face large school loans and need to gain additional flight time after graduation. THE SOLUTION: Is right on our back door at Compass Aviation in Shelby, NC. Compass Aviation is a non-profit organization that seeks to solve this problem. Its objectives are:

- 1. Provide future missionary pilot/mechanics with aviation experience in their facility where they can gain flight hours and maintenance proficiency required by mission organizations. Typically, this is a Commercial certificate with 500 flight hours, and an A&P rating with 1 year shop experience.
- 2. To help missionary candidates reduce educational and training debts by providing them the flight hours and proficiency needed- at little to no cost. This is done by allowing them to fly maintenance positioning flights for free, and subsidized flight time.
- 3. To provide these candidates with sufficient time and flexibility to raise any additional financial support needed to complete their missionary training. For those not familiar, missionaries are typically required to raise financial support for their time in the mission field from churches or individuals.

John Watt and Andy Porter are the leadership and maintenance training staff of this organization that currently consists of 4 candidates in various stages of flight and maintenance training for the mission field. Currently Compass Aviation has 4 mechanics, 2 with IA designations, and a CFII with 30+ years of mission aviation training and field experience.

Compass Aviation offers aircraft rental as well as a full line of maintenance services. Employees operate as domestic missionaries, meaning they do not collect a salary but raise support from churches and individuals for their living expenses. Profits from rentals and maintenance operations are used to cover overhead and to help subsidize training costs for mission pilot candidates.

Mission field candidates typically come already possessing a Private pilots license and an A&P rating but little field experience. They are gifted and feel called to full-time overseas service. They have already made a significant investment, but need additional help to meet the experience requirements of the various mission organizations. After completion, they would go on to serve with organizations such as JAARS, Mission Aviation Fellowship, or one of a hundred others providing aviation services to mission organizations.

Currently, Compass Aviation has a beautiful Arion Lightening for sale as well as a brandnew Murphy Moose/Super Rebel kit — still in the crate! Proceeds from the sales will be used to fund an engine overhaul and other repairs on their training aircraft, and will also subsidize candidate training.
