Meeting Report – 3/7/2017


A core group gathered on a wintery night for a meal and to start mapping out this year's events.

- Thanks to Jen and Mark Jacob, we already have several *Young Eagles rallies* scheduled. All are on a Saturday unless otherwise indicated on the calendar included later in this newsletter. Jen will present more details at next month's meeting.
- We discussed hosting another *Wings program*. Carolyn Haley reported on an conversation she is having with John Wood of the FAA. He did a presentation here last summer on "Loss of Control," and is hoping to return this summer with a new talk called "Accident Lessons" and again in late fall this year for a presentation on "Winter Operations." Dates for these are in the works and will be announced when firm.
- We're already firm on continuing our annual *Leaf-Peeper Fly-In* as the chapter's main event. It will be held October 14, and may be supplemented concurrently by another Young Eagles rally. A planning committee will be formalized at the August chapter meeting, after key people involved return from EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh.
- There's a cross-Vermont *Sip & Dip* in the works, with updates on this to come at next meeting. This event will promote flying to all ten Vermont state airports.
- Also next meeting: Dave Sternberg will do a presentation about the changing medical rules for pilots: what's current and anticipated, and what we all need to know.
- Gary Joseph gave us the *treasurer's report*. We've got a comfortable amount in the kitty, and we're all paid up with EAA National dues and insurance. We will continue donating to EAA's Peter Burgher Fund, which is a dollar-for-dollar matching fund that solely supports "chapter development by providing tools to enhance training and chapter growth." We are continuing our chapter's practice of donating at the Platinum level (\$100). Gary raised the question of whether we should invest some of our capital

into resources, such as tools, equipment, or other items of specialized use to the chapter now and in the future. If you have ideas about this, please share by e-mailing EAA968@vermontel.net, or offering your thoughts at a meeting.

Gary also opened the subject of inventorying and evaluating our hard-goods assets, i.e., the furniture and space in hangar B that comprise a pilot's lounge and supply closets. Also, no one has recently inspected the Lisa Fall campground, to make sure it's ready for anyone to use. Dave Sternberg, Carolyn Haley, and Mike Petralia started planning this initial inspection and developing a work party, but schedule conflicts and recent heavy snow may put that off for a while longer.

• Carolyn Haley reported on an inquiry she made to EAA National about our chapter hosting a stop on the *Aluminum Overcast B-17 tour*. The plane is coming to the East Coast this fall, but it will be too far south to catch us, save for one stop in Hartford (see calendar). We will work with EAA National to host a tour stop when the plane is next in the Northeast.

- Charlie North and Carolyn Haley attended the Airport Committee meeting on 2/23 and learned more about the taxiway *improvements at KRUT* this summer. The construction window is May 1 through September 6, 2017, and will start with ground preparations at the northern end of runway 1-19 then construction of the new taxiway C alongside it. The peak work will occur in July, with a tentatively scheduled closure of runway 1-19 on 7/17–20 and 7/24–27, when there will be 24-hour work activity. Runway 13-31 will remain open.
- There will also be a runway extension at Middlebury 6B0, which will force a closure for sixty days in early summer. The state is hosting a pre-construction *fly-in breakfast and seminar on Saturday, April 8*, 8:00 a.m. to noon. The upgrades include widening and lengthening the existing runway as well as developing a proper 240-foot "safety area" on the southern end of the runway. There will also be clearing of obstructions along the approach paths. Unfortunately, while construction is in process the runway will need to be shut down, including no landing on the grass. Celebrations are being planned for the reopening.

• A reminder on *membership*: The year is advancing fast, so remember to renew your chapter membership! It's good for a calendar year, and costs only \$20. To be a Chapter 968 member, you must also belong to EAA National. Their dues are \$40/year. Any new chapter member not already with EAA will be provided a complimentary six-month trial membership to EAA National upon joining the chapter.
