Remembering Dave McKenzie by Don MacDonald


Our friend and fellow chapter member passed away on April 18, 2021, and Hugo Ritzenthaler asked me to jot down a few remembrances. Dave McKenzie was involved in the formation of IAC Chapter 88, and liked to tell the story that the chapter number was chosen so that when painted on an airplane, it reads the same upright or inverted. Many of our meetings involved families, even pot luck refreshments at a week-end meeting. Some meetings were "project visitations" to a members home where a homebuilt airplane was under construction. Such a meeting took place at Dave's house in Inkster, MI, where he had to build a garage first in order to have a place to build the replica Great Lakes. An unfortunate crash destroyed the "Lakes", but included for information is a photo of the airplane piloted by Dave. In our own family, our son's two sons (our grandsons) spent



several summers with us, and both Chris and Michael got to know Dave pretty well through the chapter activities. Dave was contest chief judge several years and at the contests, the boys both ran score sheets and flipped panels - "no flight without white". Hard to think there was a time when the contest accommodated airplanes without electrical systems or radios, but that is how it was. When I searched for a photo of Dave, the first one I found is him with our grandsons, and that photo is included. The boys are now grown men, Chris

(L,34) and Michael (R,31), but they have always remembered "Mr. McKenzie". In addition

to our contests, the boys attended several of the "corn roast" fly-in gatherings at McKenzie's Landing (Dave's grass airstrip and home). These gatherings included peanut drops for the kids and EAA Young Eagle rides. It was at one of these events that the boys had a ride with John Maxfield in his Cessna 195 and now have their names in "The World's Largest Logbook" - the EAA listing of Young Eagles. When



Michael visited Michigan some years back, we made a point of driving out to Howell and having lunch with "Mr. McKenzie". The boys enjoyed him, as we all did. Dave was one-of-a-kind and will be missed.

Furthermore, we are in the process of requesting a meeting with Bay City Attorney and City Manager.
