## Editorial Notes by Rich Prange

Ford Tri-Motor

"Ooooh, the wheels on the bus go round and round..." And, so did the wheels of the Ford Tri-motor aircraft that delivered school children to

and from a school down in the island communities of southwestern Lake Erie. The islands of Kelley, Middle Bass, North Bass and Rattlesnake were the home base of Island Airways

Milton "Red" Hersberger, an early barnstormer, established Island Airways in the mid **1930's to service the needs of** the island residents as well as growing tourism. During peak **air time Milton's two, some**times three, Fords averaged as many four take-offs and landings per hour flying island guests and freight.

During the heyday years of this S.W. Lake Erie island group there was of course a significant school kid population. Some kids got to class on foot, some by boat and a few by airplane. One short hop from Rattlesnake Island was so quick that the Ford wheels would still be spinning at the next landing. "Ooooh, the wheels on the bus....."

Along with many other aviation related issues and facts, this writer did not have a clue about the Ford Tri –Motor. The original platform started out as a Stout Monoplane powered by a single Liberty engine.

All the flyers that I hang out with give full credit to Hank Ford and company. Henry bought the Stout Company



and all design rights from William Bushnell Stout in 1925.

In that same era the "PIC" of these flying machines thought they had to be out there in the breeze for the sensation of flight; Ford changed that notion with a closed cockpit and also added two engines. The "Tri-Motor" was off to production--Henry Ford assembly line style.

Fast forward to NC8407 now based at EAA headquarters-what a work history. Model 4-AT-E, number 146 of 199, built and sold to Pitcairn Airways then leased to Cubana as part of their national fleet, next sold to the Government of the Dominican Republic. The remainder of this aircraft's resume' would be numerous tours of barnstorming, a prop for several movie sets, borate bomber and a smoke jumper ride for the USFS, and crop sprayer. In 1973, hauling rides at a Burlington, WI, air show


the Tri – Ford got totaled in a fierce rain storm.

EAA bought the wreckage and after a twelve year restoration project, brought the old Ford back to duty as one of the

mainstay features of AirVenture. When working at the Oshkosh sea plane base I see the Ford Tri-Motor as one of the first and last airplanes at work during the air show.
