

Help Save KRRL Runways 16 and 34

The Merrill Airport Commission has been trying to save and Reconstruct RWYs 16/34 at KRRL for over 10 years. We are attempting to accurately document our Annual Number of Operations on RWY's 16 and 34 at KRRL. You can help us do this.

The FAA is currently suggesting that the operations on our crosswind runway are insufficient to justify rebuilding 16/34. We have been told by the FAA that they presently intend to use ADS-B Out in making such Take Off and Landing operation determinations. Now we know why our numbers are way too low. FAA has admitted that possibly only fifty percent of the GA fleet is ADSB equipped, and we

believe that the ADSB Modes C is not reporting accurately in our region. We believe the FAA's Numbers are not accurately representing the Total Number of Annual Operations on RWYs 16/34 at KRRL and that we have many more than what they suggest.

You can get forms to record your Operations from Rich McCullough, KRRL Airport Manager.

Please record each Take Off and each Landing you make on RWYs 16 and 34 at KRRL. Each Take Off or Landing is considered "an Operation". Please try to also record the AWOS announced wind speed and direction for these operations. The only operations FAA will count are those in which the wind

conditions at RRL required you to use 16/34 for safety reasons based on the wind performance of your aircraft.

Please also try to record and show the Wind Direction and Velocity on your form for each Operation you make on RWYs 16/34. This is very important. Do your best to remember and record that...e.g. 320 / 9G20 KT or MPH.

We hope to track our Operations for the next year to 14 months. We hope to demonstrate and show 2000 – 2500 Annual Operations on RWYs 16/34.

We greatly appreciate your help in saving RWY 16/34
