

It seems that "Bobby and Billy"

were still, unknowingly, friends and school mates working together since and how Bob progressed our graduation from St. James school in 1942.

During my brief time at the lectern, I noted that our beautiful old church was suitably decorated to honor Bob's life. Beside the flower arrangements, supplied by our one chapter, the church still had it's Christmas decorations which included several large Balsam trees. What better tribute to this man from north country, Boulder Junction. Besides noting Bob's contributions to aviation, both Fr. Bill and I lauded

him for the love he had for both the Lord and his family. None of the older chapter members will ever forget the tender care Bob took of his handicapped sister, Mary Jean, bringing her to chapter meetings where virtually became our chapter mascot.
