Tips for Flying into the Ultralight Runway at Oshkosh

Flying into the UL area at the Oshkosh Airshow is nothing like flying into the main Oshkosh Runway. Basically, all you do is fly over 1. Highway 44 towards Oshkosh airfield at 300 feet until you cross over Highway 41 (4 lane highway). When you hit the intersection you will see the UL area straight ahead about 1 mile. If you have trouble making out the runway just circle at the intersection of 44/41 until you get yourself oriented and find the runway. As long as you stay at 300 feet or below, you are good. Flying in the Ultralight Airstrip requires no radio communication, is clearly marked on the website below, and the runway is wide and long. Once you have landed, you just clear the runway to the Airshow side and taxi to one of 3 gates. There you shut off your

engine and will meet people who will tell you where to park. Here are some more tips:

- This is the best place to find all the details related to flying in to the Ultralight Runway at Oshkosh. It included pictures and video. http:// www.airventure.org/ flying/ul.html
- 2. No radio is required to fly in. Just watch the "flag person" at the end of the runway for signals about landing. You can land if he is not holding up a red sign. If he is holding a red sign, just circle around and try again. There is a picture of the pattern on the site above.
- 3. Generally speaking, you can fly in and out any time a few days before or

after the Airshow starts/ ends. Once the Airshow starts (during the days of July 25th – July 31st) you can fly in or out only during the Ultralight Runway's scheduled flight times as shown on the website address above.

4. You will be ok as long as you don't fly on the Airshow side of the UL runway and an imaginary east/west line extending from the west end of the UL runway and also staying west of the North/South main Oshkosh Runway.


