On behalf of the newsletter staff and myself, a very Merry Christmas and a healthy Happy New Year!

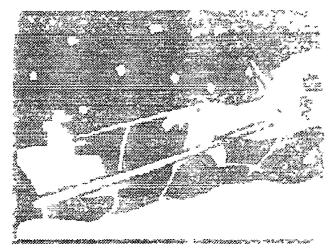

#### Flying the Gyro

My decision to fly a gyro was a long and hard one and not one of good vs. bad but more of what fit my needs. There is no perfect flying machine, though many have tried to build one. To me a perfect aircraft would be able to fly at any speed, have a glide ratio of 50 to 1, have vertical take off and landing abilities, be light weight, be fuel efficient and still look good. The Harrier jet fits some of these qualities but for obvious reasons was eliminated from my list. I was very interested in rotorcraft but could not afford the helicopters on the market at the time so I decided on the gyro. This decision is one that has proved to be good for me.

The first thing I looked for was quick portability and easy storage. By removing one bolt I can take the rotors off and push it in the garage or put it on the trailer, which takes about 10 minutes. Removal of the rotors is not necessary for garage storage but is a necessity for transportation. Living away from your runway and wanting to take your craft home after your flight is relatively easy and if you can leave your rotors in a hanger then you do not have to disassemble them. I did this for quite awhile as Steve Krueger can attest to. I was usually putting them on when he would fly to my dad's and meet me for a local flight, of which there where many. (Some of those untold stories).

The next thing I wanted in an aircraft was something that was easy to learn to fly and something with a safe rating. The gyros' safe rating came straight from the FAA as being one of the safest aircrafts built. This could open up a very long discussion and seeing as Tom and I do the Newsletter I guess I don't have to worry about space or topic. The fact that I am writing this article attests to the safety of a gyro. Any craft that is capable of three-

dimensional flight has its dangers and must be flown within the limits of the craft as well as the pilots.

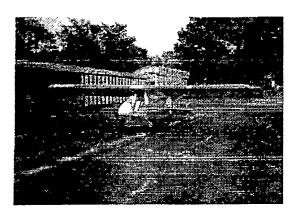
