

The 1998 Ultralight & Light Plane Safety Seminar

This years seminar was held on the lower level of the EAA Museum at Oshkosh. The official emcee was none other than Frank Beagel who started with opening remarks. This years topic was geared around the saying You always HAFTA AFTA. Meaning you have to Always Fly The Airplane. Great choice of words Frank!

The first speaker Jim Stevenson was from the Aero Sports Connection. Jim spoke about the five items the A.R.A.C., Part 103 working group have been putting together, now draft # 8 which is the Sport Pilot license vs. the old Recreational Pilot certificate. The five items are:

- 1 Proper training.
- 2 Safe vehicles.
- 3 Removing the 50 mile radius.
- 4 Self evaluated medical.
- 5 Available instructors.

Jim had a great deal of interesting views about each of the five items. Here's a couple I will remember. 1) He emphasized Education and not more Regulation! We agree with you on that one Jim. 2) We are the pioneers of todays sport and we control our own destiny. Very true. 3) Jim also talked about the importance of proper instruction and weighing out the price difference between the cost of learning to fly properly and the cost of buying parts and hopefully not medical bills of the so called self taught pilot who after buying replacement parts and landing gear still doesn't have the basics to conduct safe flying skills.

Tom Boyer did another outstanding job of Operations and Communications at Airports. I have seen this presentation before but always pick up a few new pointers from year to year. Nice job Tom. Tom is now working with the Fox Valley Technical College. Some of you may remember he accepted the position with the college after serving many years with the Department of Transportation Aeronautical Division.

With a quick one hour lunch break it was Mr. Ben Marrow taking the podium discussing preflight and condition inspection. Ben is now retired from the FAA with 30 years experience doing inspections. He is now flying ultralights and is currently a BFI with USUA.

Ben pointed out the importance of a proper preflight of looking and understanding what you are looking at. He also talked about proper building techniques and using the

proper fasteners and torqueing bolts to the proper inch and foot pounds. Some of the true stories were quite interesting to say the least.

The last speaker was none other than our very own Gordy Radtke. Nothing like saving the best for last! We may be a bit bias but we all were very proud of Gordy. He started by talking about keeping our Rotax's flying by using the proper fuel lines, primers, and primer lines then getting into the Rotax itself by doing proper maintenance. Gordy also covered proper engine running temps C.H.T. and EGT. Much was discussed about proper care during storage and fogging an engine if prolong hanger time is foreseen. There was sufficient time for questions and answers which made it nice for the audience to get involved with technical problems and the right answers from Gordy. Hats off to you Gordy, you did a great job!

Attendance this year was estimated at over 200 plus people. Everyone that registered received a complimentary Trade A Plane magazine, a choice of a Leaf or CPS catalog, and a chance to win many door prizes. Speaking of door prizes Tony Borchardt won a set of plans for a Zings Zippy Sport which is a parasol-style all wood ultralight. John Verfuerth won an all week pass for two to Oshkosh '98. 


