Summer's End Is Fast Approaching

Our extended summer might be coming to an end this weekend with the forecast of lower nighttime temperatures below 32 degrees. The trifecta for brilliant autumn colors is: a warm summer with good ground moisture, warm fall days, and cool nighttime temperatures above the freezing point. Make the most of the opportunity to enjoy the fall Colorama this weekend with a flight to your favorite forested countryside. Remember, it will be nearly 7 months before you see those same trees with leaves on, of any color!

While you're out flying looking at the fall colors, beware of the birds that you could be sharing your airspace with. While taking a short flight in the local area last week to test fly a couple of repairs to my Rans S-6, I had to deviate my flight path to avoid a red tailed hawk. My 1st reaction after that was to look for more birds in the vicinity. I haven't been flying as much as I normally do, so the lack of flight time has decreased my flying proficiency, which in turn has decreased my spatial



Bird Strikes

Robert Rossier's article in this October issue of Sport Aviation, "A 'Fowl' Weather Day", presents the reader with a good knowledge of bird habits and habitats to aid the pilot in recognizing areas of potential increased bird strikes. There are over 9,000 annual bird strikes in the United States alone, with 53 percent of them happening between July and November each year.

Increasing our knowledge of daily bird activities, like morning and evening peak feeding times, areas of preferred habitat, and common activities occurring during the day, the more we know about birds and their activities will give us a greater understanding of their likely response to



their perceived threat of us. Gathering data from bird strikes is another means to help us learn where the majority of strikes occur. Nearly 90 percent of all bird strikes occur around airports. Of those, 32 percent occur when taking off, and 62 percent occur while a pilot is on approach for landing. The article also details the fact that 71 percent of bird strikes occur below 500 feet AGL, but decreases as altitude increases.

Birds will normally react to threats in perceived manners depending on their locations when threatened. Birds in flight will normally dive when threatened, and if they are threatened while on the ground, they will likely take to flight. With my new found **knowledge of birds, I don't** think I will be flying any whooping cranes to their winter nesting grounds anytime soon!

- Announce down wind right before you turn because it's easier to see you when you turn in a bank.
- Set frequencies ahead of time if possible.
- Take offs and landing are the busiest times of flight so brief your passengers about a sterile cockpit.
- Be courteous and aware fly the plane all the way to the hangar.
