#### 2023 Chapter 75 Spring Flying Adventure

Like our long awaited Spring, this year's Chapter 75 flying adventure was not quite ready to blossom into what we hoped would be one of our flying highlights of the year. Our May 13th departure date was postponed due to weather in our immediate area, as well as along our intended fly path to our Kansas destinations. As Sunday rolled around, we all got the message of our rendezvous at Sauk Prairie Airport at 0830, "tomorrow" morning. At that time, we would become a flight of 6 for the next 4 days! Game on! Departing W23 for the 68 miles flight to Sauk Prairie Airport, for me, was as calm as it was quiet. That changed with the radio frequency switched to 122.9,

with the gathering of planes at our rendezvous point. As we landed, we topped off with fuel, then discussed current and expected weather along our flight path. After our final prepping, we fired up our planes and positioned ourselves in what would become our flying order for most of the trip Steve and Karen Krueger, in their Champ, were the lead plane, with one piloting while the other worked the electronics for weather and traffic. Evan and Colleen Hansen in their Champ, and Mike Riley in his Rans Raven flew in the #2 and #3 positions. The 3 Rans S-6's were trailing with Lyle and Mary Banzer flying drag on the flock. Dan "3 O'clock High" Marlenga was our airport traffic monitor for the trip. Since I was on "holiday", I was along for the ride, soaking up all that the "Heartland" had to offer. Three more fuel stops and 500+ miles put us in Norfolk, NE, hometown of Johnny Carson. We were lucky enough to have a whole day of smooth tailwinds, but found ourselves pushed west by weather. Hotel and FBO sleeping accommodations were the lodgings for the night, with weather still a potential factor for the

morning. And it was, with low ceilings nearing our minimums, the final 250 miles and Hutchinson KS were made. Our next stop was the "Cosmosphere", which is a space museum that houses the largest collection of Russian spaceflight artifacts outside of Moscow, and a collection of US space artifacts second only to the National Air and Space Museum in Washington, DC. Just entering the museum necessitates your walking under a SR-71 Blackbird, having 1600 hrs of flight time. Amazing! But time marched on while we flew to Lloyd Stearman Field, a night of meeting local flying celebrities, and a day of hospitality to see the Kansas Aviation Museum in Wichita. Then taking to wing on our 1st stop of our return trip, Gardner, KS. That was a busy 36 hours. First light found us already airbound and pushing north with a tailwind on our race to beat a frontal system to our prospective home airports. While homeward bound, our "porkchop frequency" was on the quiet side. A memorable group outing, plus a significant tailwind, is a recipe for introspection. Here is Dan's recipe: Hobbs time of 17.8 (Continued on page 3)
