While taking a break from my duties at the Wild Rose Airport Annual Pancake Breakfast Flyin, held on June 12th, I sat

across from a couple of UL Chapter 75 members to schmooze with them over recent local aviation happenings, as well as reminiscing about past events and mutual friends. Slowly I began sensing a change in the rhythm of the conversation, along with a cocking of the

head, a squinting of the visible eye, and the forward lean of the speaker's upper body over the table. Then,...a brief pause before continuing..."In your newsletter article about the painting of a Boeing 747, I can't follow the math to get the answer that you did". I was ecstatic, as well as relieved to hear that! There was at least one chapter member who read the front page of the newsletter before using it to line their cat's litter box. And to think that I was getting the "stink eve" for a bad breakfast sausage, or a possible piece of shell in the scrambled eggs.

Shortly after promising to check my facts and math on the Boeing paint job, another chapter 75 member and Wild Rose airport flier contributed to the airplane paint job conversation by saying that the paint on a C-5 weighed 9 tons. "That's the weight of a small herd of



elephants", was the first response heard. Not wanting to touch the math on that one, I Googled the question of paint on the C-5 and got an answer of 2,600 lbs. of paint.

Not only did all fly-in participants have a good hearty breakfast, entertaining conversations, a chance to meet old friends and make new ones, it is the draw of the flying experience and the aviation community that brings us together. In total, 7 airplanes from Chapter 75 made the flight to the Wild Rose fly-in. Of those, the majority of planes were built or restored by their owners.

A Second Chance

In the February chapter newsletter, a question was posed



asking what a paint job on a Boeing 747 weighs. The statistics given were: the weight of the paint at 9 lbs/ gal, paint composed of 60 % solids, spray equipment efficiency is 50%,

and a total of 120 gal. needed to paint a Boeing 747. These facts and figures would put the final dried paint weight at 324 lbs., not 3,240 lbs. as quoted in the newsletter. From now on I will have to watch my P's, Q's, and decimal points. One never knows if a cat


reads while in the litter box!

Another internet site that quotes Boeing for its information, has paint weighing 11.5 lbs/gal and 160.87 gal. used to coat a 747. Spray efficiency being the same at 50%, as is the volatile liquids at 40%. What does the dried paint weigh? Darrell, you do the math this time!

Candi, you were right about the paint required to spray a C-5, as erroneously quoted to us at 9 tons, being as much as a small herd of elephants. On average, an elephant herd composed of 3 cows and their calves would weigh around 18,000 lbs.


