# Editors Notes by Rich Prange

This writer will be out of the loop, traveling, for most of October. Therefore, some of my thoughts and observations will be a bit disjointed and definitely random. Tomorrow I finish a four day work week on Washington Island, Wisconsin, home to a grass strip airport worth bragging about.

The FAA identifier is 2P2 and the local pilots say the grass runways are second to none. The orientations are 2/20 and 14/32 at 653 ft. el. Both strips are 2200 plus ft. with no end-of-runway obstructions. This Door County island community is a beautiful destination and in my estimation, a very doable flight for most Chapter 75 pilots.

Here on the Island, feathered aviators are stacked up for a rest before their next water crossing. On a clear, calm day the flight across Death's Door is not a problem for a rested bird. I'm told by a couple of local amateur ornithologists the mortality rate gets significant on a cold stormy day. Here at Jackson Harbor, warblers, bluebirds and robins are collected in their loose but discrete flocks. I hope they wait for proper clearance from Mother Nature at ATC before departure to the major flyways.

Back at RRL there is a

resident pair of Kestrels who parented one kid this summer. At the north end of the airport, mid-summer, I was fortunate to spot, on two occasions, a Tersel. Not to be confused with the 70's Toyota. A Tersel is a male Peregrine Falcon and they have to be one of nature's finest aviators. These guys can dive at nearly 200 mph. The first cold blasts and the

first shivers of fall prompt

some of us to find a warm spot and maybe mothball our flying machines for the season. Now what? Fix, repair, modify? If all those issues are covered, your leaves are raked, your deer hunting went bust, and your driveway is plowed, you might consider a reading list. I have one suggestion, if for no other reason than the first chapter. The book, Off Main Street is a collection of short stories by Michael Perry, a Wisconsin author from New Auburn. The first chapter, "A Way with Wings," will probably suck you into reading the whole book. Enjoy.

I will be on the road tomorrow, weather permitting. The first serious stop will be an Amish community in Indiana, and then back into the 21st century at Dearborn, MI, the Henry Ford Museum. Is that a contradiction? The next


