Gumps Flying Circus

The morning of July 14, 1996, started off with 1300 - 1700 ft. overcast and westerly winds about 10 knots. This day was also the date for the 2nd annual Gump's ultralight competition in Royalton. Since last year when our little club



entered four competitors, a return engagement was a necessity. The plan was wheels up at 8:00 a.m. so off to the airport for the preflight. By 7:45 only 3 people were ready to go. Paul Jaeger and I were to go in the GT-500 and Steve Norris was riding his motorcycle.

With the GPS tracking 176° our first step was Stevens Point where Paul arranged to have fuel ready and we were to pick up Rich Iverson with his Kolb. Rich brought the fuel but the ultralight stayed home. After a short visit with Rich, it was off to Iola for a pancake breakfast. With four grass runways Iola is an ultralights best friend. When our tank was full "of pancakes", and 10:00 a.m. was staring at us, once again the GT sprang to life. From Iola to Royalton was 10 miles and with a high speed fly by to announce our arrival we were safely on the ground by the 10:30 cut off time.

This years' competition was the same as last years with Carrier Landing, Bomb Drop, and Torpedo Bombing contests. Eleven competitors entered, and after our flight and safety briefing we had the national anthem to officially start the competition. The first event was the Carrier Landing with low scores had by all. Event #2 was the Bomb Drop and once again only 1/2 of us even dropped anything in the target area. By event #3 it was 1:30 p.m. and thermals and mechanical winds entered as factors for the Torpedo Run. Scores were high by most competitors in this last event.

Our club was represented by competitors Steve Norris and Dan Marlenga. Our club photos were taken by Paul Jaeger and cheers and encouragement came by way of John Riesinger and Orlyn & Kaye Hansen. We respectfully brought home second place hats in all 3 events to keep our winning ways intact. After refueling the GT Paul and I were off toward home. With a headwind and 46 miles to travel we were en-route for 65 minutes and arrived safely back home by 5:00 p.m.

Even though we had some low overcast early the 40% chance of rain never materialized. The 60% sunshine ended up to mean a great day for all. I truly hope we can get more of our club members to participate in these and other great fly-in events. Happy Flying!


