TREASURER'S REPORT

I decided to make the move when the American River Bank, where the Chapter's account has resided for over 20 years, was to be merged with and to become The Bank of Marin. I was concerned that I would have issues with the transition because of the difficulties I encountered with my personal bank Schools Financial Credit Union when they were merged into Schools First Federal Credit Union, which became a month-long nightmare. Hoping to avoid a repeat of the difficulties I encountered with Schools First, I moved the account to Wells Fargo on Freeport Blvd.

I must say that the move has not been without difficulties with Wells Fargo's customer service, which is not great. They claim because of staffing shortages caused by the Covid -19 pandemic. It's a long story but we are still waiting for their security branch to allow Kim as a signatory on the account.
