

My Fifth Month with the Ray Aviation Scholarship

Balancing my college education and flying became particularly challenging this month as my winter quarter finals consumed a majority of my time. However, I was able to complete my overnight cross country with Stan on March 7. We left from KEDU at 18:05 and took off to Modesto. The night view was so beautiful from the aerial view, but then I had to put on foggles and practice instrument flying. We then made it to Modesto where we did four night landings. After we departed the pattern, we flew to KSAC where we also landed. I had a hard time identifying the blinking green and white light at tower, but I found it eventually. After landing at KSAC, we departed the pattern and headed back to KEDU.





Since then, I have practiced my crosswind, softfield, and short field takeoffs and landings at Franklin. I enjoy crosswind takeoffs but I still have trouble identifying when to front slip and when to flare on my crosswind landings. Hopefully Sacramento will get some more wind so I can practice soon. Tomorrow, I will be doing my Dual cross country to Chico, Santa Rosa, KEDU, and back to KSAC. The following week I plan to do my solo cross country to

Madera, Los Banos, and back to KSAC. I am learning to file flight plans on paper and on Foreflight. I am very excited to do my solo cross country.

In the next month, I need to study in preparation for my checkride and oral exam. I will be taking Physics, Calc 3, and Chem 2 at UC Davis, so it will be a heavy workload but I am prepared to focus. I plan to test for my private pilot license at the end of May. Wish me luck!

YOUNG EAGLES - SACRAMENTO REPORT

Spring is in the air, which means more flying! In addition, the young eagles are continuing to work on annuals for the RV-10 and RV-4, building the helicopter, cleaning hangars, practicing on the flight simulator, and attending Arduino sessions hosted by Kyle Rodrigues.

What has everyone been up to?

Austin Thomas is our first Ray Scholarship recipient of 2023! He is starting more consistent flight training with Stan and practiced crosswind landings the other day! He hopes to complete his first solo in the next month. In addition, he helped work on the annual for Nick's Van's RV-10 and helped Tyler with the annual for the RV4.

Rachel Long, our second Ray Scholarship recipient from 2022, accomplished her dual cross country on Thursday, March 30th from Sacramento Executive Airport (KSAC) to Chico Municipal Airport (KCIC) to Sonoma County "aka Charlie Brown" Airport (KSTS) and then to University Airport (KEDU) to fuel. After fueling, she flew with foggles, tracking the Sacramento VOR to 600ft. Stan Lawrence, CFI, said she did an "outstanding job of learning the art of cross country flying, cockpit management being a bid learning factor." She maintained her compass heading and altitude while communicating with NorCal Approach and Oakland Center, in addition to receiving ADS-B weather and traffic information via ForeFlight.
