

Here are a few thoughts shared by Lilah and May...

#### Hello,

Since my last update, I have completed a short solo flight up to Lampson Field, and back to KSAC, in preparation for my long solo cross-country flight. On August 27th, I completed my long solo cross-country to Redding, Lampson Field, and back to Sacramento. I was quite pleased with how smoothly the flight went. I absolutely love flying to Lampson; it is gorgeous up there. Since then, I have completed a few training flights with my instructor Stan, focusing mainly on crosswind landings, short and soft field landings, spot landings, stalls, and steep turns. I still have quite a bit of work to do in preparation for my check ride, but I am eager to continue progressing in my training. For now, I will continue to work on maneuvers with Stan, as well as study for my upcoming check ride. I also hope to get some spin training, prior to taking my check ride. Two weekends ago I attended a fly out to Ukiah with several Young Eagles. I was fortunate enough to fly right seat with VAA 25 member Tim Redden, in a Comanche. Tim is an incredible pilot, he flew in the 50 ship of RVs at AirVenture this year. I learned quite a bit from flying with him. In addition to these experiences, I also attended the Reno Air Races alongside several Young Eagles, and a couple VAA 25 members; an experience that I cherished greatly. I had a wonderful time. This upcoming weekend, instead of attending VAA 25's Build Maintain program, I will be at Sacramento's Air and Space Museum, talking to young girls interested in aviation about the Ray Scholarship, as well as VAA Chapter 25 and EAA Chapter 52. I am excited to represent both chapters and encourage other kids like me to seriously consider aviation as a prospect for their future.
