#### SAFETY FIRST

As customary, each new year brings thoughts and goals (resolutions) for the upcoming year. Among dropping some excess weight, my goal this year is to become a safer pilot. To me that means becoming proficient at instrument flying again (haven't used the rating since gaining it in the early 2000's), and giving frequent focus to emergency procedures.

Compared to just 15 years ago, there are 100's more sources of training material available and most of it is free. Of interest are the FAA's Safety Team (FAASTeam) resources at www.faasafety.gov. There are many courses, seminars, and webinars for both pilots and mechanics. A popular program for pilots is the WINGS pilot proficiency program where you can get credit for

flight training and knowledge courses to obtain various phases and levels of the program. The goal of the program is to maintain currency and proficiency and become a safer pilot. Refer to the WINGS portion of the site or download AC 61-91J to learn more. There's also content there beyond the WINGS courses. Just click the Library tab within the Resources section and you can find courses of interest.

Another great source for free content is at www.youtube.com. One of my favorites is Jason Schappert of MzeroA Flight Training. From taking you through actual flights with ATC audio to teaching ground school topics, Jason has posted around 500 videos built around flight training. Check him out.

#### EAA AIRVENTURE CELEBRATES 50 YEARS AT OSHKOSH



EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin — (December 20, 2018) — The Experimental Aircraft Association is marking the 50th consecutive year of its annual EAA AirVenture Oshkosh fly-in convention in Oshkosh in 2019 with a full schedule of activities for arriving aviators and residents of EAA's hometown. The 67th annual event is July 22-28 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh.

The EAA fly-in convention was first held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1953. In 1959, the event moved to Rockford,

Illinois, where it was held annually through 1969 before coming to Oshkosh. EAA moved its permanent headquarters from the Milwaukee area to Oshkosh in 1983.

"A half-century ago, EAA founder Paul Poberezny saw Oshkosh as the perfect place to bring together aviation enthusiasts," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "Oshkosh has become synonymous with 'The World's Greatest Aviation Celebration' so it's a natural that we commemorate 50 consecutive years here with events that involve those who attend and those who have made the city such a welcoming place for aviators."

EAA is seeking any of the showplanes present at the 1970 EAA fly-in convention and inviting the current owners to bring them to Oshkosh next summer. They will be featured in exclusive parking areas on the grounds. In addition, EAA is seeking members and volunteers who will be attending their 50th consecutive fly-in in 2019, and unique memorabilia and stories from the 1970 event that will add to the history of what has grown to be the largest annual fly-in in the world. In 2018, EAA AirVenture Oshkosh welcomed more than 600,000 people from 87 nations, along with more than 10,000 aircraft.

As a thank you to Oshkosh residents for welcoming the aviation world to their city for the past half-century, there will be special offers for community members and additional ways to engage in this historic milestone. Those details and

other are still in development, and will be announced as they are finalized.

"Over 50 years, nearly every significant aircraft type in the world has landed on the runways at Wittman Regional Airport to be part of the EAA fly-in," Larsen said. "More important are the stories of the people who have come to be a part of this event and the legacy of what is now known simply as 'Oshkosh.' That is what we will be celebrating in 2019."

#### WHERE TO GO?

I hope everyone received the file I emailed out to the membership with over 50 places to fly for food or things to do in the area. Shoot me a note if you didn't and I'll get it to you.

I recently noticed that Pogue Municipal has 100LL priced much lower than any other airports at \$3.50/gallon. If you can squeeze in 50+ gallons, you get an additional \$0.10 off. While you're there, hop in one of their courtesy cars and check out Minuteman Pizza Parlor in Sand Springs...you may not find better pizza in the Midwest.

Like a good beer? Grab your growler and head over to Emporia Municipal (EMP) in Kansas. They have a courtesy car for the short trip into town to Radius Brewing Company to get the beer of your choice to go. Also try Bobby D's which is across the street for some great Kansas barbecue.

A new café has opened on a field not too far away. Louise at Thaden Field, Bentonville, AR (VBT), just east of Northwest Regional Airport. It's a very modern setting, the food was great and the staff was friendly. They're closed on Mondays, but open at 8am to 9pm everyday with exception to closing at 2pm on Sundays. It is co-located at the NW end of the field with Summit Aviation's FBO and flight school. They have a nice pilot shop with merchandise and you can selftour the brand new building and deck overlooking the large pond.

Want to picnic next to a small lake next to a nice asphalt runway? Check out Crystal Lake (5M5) near Decatur, AR. It's a private field that's open to the public which is adjacent to the city-owned lake with a dock and picnic tables. May need to take the belly-boat and fishing poles this Spring.
