



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# **CAP Squadron 308 October and November Update**

In October, members of Squadron 308 were joined by members from the York Squadron for a field trip to Hagerstown Airport. Cadets and Senior Members visited a Lifenet helicopter, viewed the world from the ATC tower, saw behind the scenes at Rider Jet Center, explored massive aircraft at the Aviation Museum, operated a high tech firetruck at the Airport Fire Department, sat in a Southern Airways Express C-208B, played with jet and reciprocating engines at Pittsburgh Institute of Aircraft Maintenance, and flew a Redbird simulator at Hagerstown Flight School. All with a pizza buffet for lunch.





The first weekend of November saw Squadron members completing a service project cleaning up a site at the Gettysburg National Battlefield. We also had five cadets complete PT testing that weekend. Later that week we had two cadet promotions: L. Sullivan to Cadet Airman and C. Tatara to Cadet Senior Airman. As well, senior member Jeff Robeson earned his Yeager award, and the entire squadron was presented with an award for excellence in Aerospace Education.

The third weekend of November was focused on Ground Team preparation. Five senior members and two cadets completed certification in Basic Life Support/CPR/AED, basic First Aid, Advanced Bleeding Control, Blood Borne Pathogens, and Epinephrine Administration. Classes were taught by our own 1Lt Greg Williams.

Finally, as the Squadron prepared for Thanksgiving, we celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the end of the Great War by hosting a guest, Tim Edwards, Executive Director of the Susquehanna Area Regional Airport Authority. His



presentation was followed by a talk on the Real Red Baron by our Cadet Aerospace Education Officer, C/SMSgt G. Kotlinski; an informative session on the development of aviation technology during WWI by Maj Rob Clark, and flying WWI planes in a simulator.



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

# John Donmoyer Remembers Doersom Airport and Charles Doersom

I started flying lessons in January, 1959 in a Piper J-3 from Doersom Airport. My instructor was Art Cunningham, a WWII pilot. Later I bought a Piper PA-14 Family Cruiser airplane and hangered it with Charlie Doersom when the hangar, shop, fuel pumps and the Doersom home were located on the airport near the Lincoln Highway.

Charlie was friendly and I spent many hours talking with him about airplanes and flying. He was an interesting person with experience dating back to the very beginning of aviation in Adams County.

I happened to be at the airport that fateful Sunday morning July 7, 1963 when Charlie died. I hadn't gotten my airplane from the hangar yet, as two other airplanes would need to be moved to access my Piper Family Cruiser. Together we were watching a transient airplane landing on the NE runway. As the airplane was taxiing to the fuel pumps, I turned my back to do something else and in a minute or two, returned to the airport office to find Charlie on the floor. He was still breathing but beginning to turn blue. I propped his head up and made certain he wasn't choking. The transient pilot was at the door, so I asked him to watch Charlie while I drove to the house (no phone in the office hangar). I pounded on the door and when Mrs. Doersom answered, I suggested she call the ambulance.

Gettysburg had only one ambulance and I remember the driver was Don Staub. I helped him place Charlie on the stretcher and then into the ambulance. I never did go flying that day.

While Don Sullivan was leasing the airport, I remember that Arthur Godfrey arrived in a Ford Tri-motor airplane to meet with town and county officials. The Tri-motor was a restored American Airlines airplane from the late 1920s, flown by senior AA pilots and used for airline promotions. Later that day, Don and I had an opportunity to take a tour of the interior and flight deck.

Again, during Sullivan's time, there was a conference meeting of Government officials from close-by states when several multi-engine airplanes flew in, the largest a DC-3.


On another occasion I was at the airport when Arnold Palmer flew his Aero Commander to Doersom Airport for the weekend. Shortly after landing, a military helicopter came in low over the trees from the south, likely from Ike's farm, landed, Arnie boarded, then the helicopter departed with retired president Eisenhower already on board, for a weekend of golfing!




