




The February meeting will review the Ray Aviation Scholarship and the Chapter's commitment and obligations if we are selected as an eligible chapter.

supremacy of the "Mighty Eighth" is described by those who experienced it...and survived it.



In The Mighty Eighth, the men who fought in the greatest air war in human history tell their stories of courage and camaraderie as only those who were there can tell them.


Questions of the month Is there a situation in which you could be at the controls at night, doing your three takeoffs and landings if you are not night current and you have a passenger with you?






