

We met in the hanger to promote social distancing.



HOW AIRCRAFT PISTON ENGINES WORK

Have you ever wondered about what makes that propeller turn? The Barnstormers will offer their members a special opportunity to learn more about piston engines used in GA aircraft.

Chapter President, Henry Hartman, has been involved with small-engine powered equipment for nearly 50 years, and for about 40 years has been teaching Adult Education Classes on Small Engine Repair. The Covid pandemic has canceled so many events, including Henry's usual Spring and Fall classes, so he is offering to conduct an opportunity involving three, FREE, 2-hour sessions. The goal is not to make you an A&P mechanic, but to familiarize people with the various parts of the engine and be comfortable with the terminology used to describe those parts and their conditions. The free classes will be held on Tuesday evenings, starting at 7pm and ending by 9pm. Here is a schedule:

Tuesday, Sept. 29 – THE BASICS OF THE 4-STROKE-CYCLE ENGINE. We will discuss theory of operation, including crankcases, crankshafts, connecting rods, pistons & rings, cylinders, camshafts, lifters, push rods, valves, oil pumps, and more. In-line engines, opposed (boxer) engines, V-engines, and those beautiful radial engines will be described. If participants are interested, an explanation of 2-stroke-cycle engines can be included.

Tuesday, Oct. 6 – CARBURETORS AND FUEL SYSTEMS. This session will dive into how an engine is fed with a mixture of gasoline and air that produces power. Items covered will include venturis, floats, fuel inlet (float) valves, throttle valves, mixture controls, carb heat controls (and why they are needed), and more.


Tuesday, Oct. 20 – AIRCRAFT IGNITION SYSTEMS. Now that we have fuel in the engine, it needs to be ignited to produce usable power. We will learn about those mysterious magnetos and their components: rotors, coils, points, condensers, and impulse couplings. There will also be discussion about spark plugs and the critical importance of proper ignition timing, along with dual ignition.
