


The Life of Captain Lawrence John Ritter


On Friday, April 26, 1946, less than a year after the Allies celebrated Victory in World War II, a highly-decorated Ace Pilot from the Mediterranean theater was flying a P-47 Thunderbolt from Selfridge Field in Michigan to Mitchel Field, Long Island, NY. A sudden severe snowstorm across the north-central mountains of Pennsylvania caught the pilot by surprise and the plane crashed, killing the sole occupant, Captain Lawrence John Ritter.

Local residents of the Slate Run area of northwest Lycoming County reported hearing a plane in the storm and a loud crash. Despite a massive ground and aerial search effort involving more than 10,000 man-hours, no trace of a crash site was found. That is, until the following November when hunters discovered the wreckage.

The story of Captain Ritter might have been mostly lost to history, until Lock Haven resident Rick Bressler started to research the life of Captain Ritter. Prior to becoming an Army Air Corp fighter pilot and earning status as an Ace, "Larry" Ritter was a gifted athlete in high school and college. Mr. Bressler's book is a tribute to an American hero who served his country with great valor, and died while still serving his country. Published by Gatekeeper Press, the ISBN paperback # is 9781642378047.



Homebuilders Week - Online Event Starts January 26



An online opportunity to learn about all aspects of building your own aircraft

EAA is launching a new online learning event for aircraft builders: (www.EAA.org/HomebuildersWeek). It will be five straight days of educational forums covering a broad spectrum of aircraft building topics. It will launch on Tuesday, January 26, 2021, and run until Saturday, January 30, 2021. The live online presentations will be open to everyone interested in building their own aircraft. Sessions will start

at 1 p.m. CST and run until 8:30 p.m. CST daily.

This event is an opportunity for a new person to jump in with both feet and learn a lot about the wonderful world of homebuilding. We will cover areas like getting started successfully and techniques when building with sheet metal, composites, steel, and wood. But it won't be just for the newbie; we are offering in-depth talks on panel planning, engine selection, FAA certification, flight testing, and selling a homebuilt aircraft. There will be something for every builder, whether you are just starting out, knee deep in a project, or just received your airworthiness certificate — it is going to be a great learning opportunity.

EAA is working with industry experts, kit manufacturers, and other subject matter experts to provide top-notch material for builders. The sessions will be live and allow plenty of time for attendee questions. Recordings will be archived and available to EAA members for review.

The launch of EAA Homebuilders Week coincides with the 68th anniversary of the founding of the Experimental Aircraft Association in 1953. Those founding members of EAA lit the fuse on the homebuilt movement that provides affordable access to aircraft ownership and today has spread worldwide.



Holiday greetings to our partners, tenants, and friends at Capital City Executive Airport, Franklin County Regional Airport, and Gettysburg Regional Airport:

As always, we hope that you had a good Thanksgiving and this message finds you in good health. Please feel free to share this update with other tenants and airport users.

2020 has certainly been a year of challenges. The resurgence of COVID-19 cases has impacted aviation, though it is still to soon to know whether this is a small blip or a longer-term flattening of the modest growth we have seen since April. In either case, SARAA's Board and staff continue to follow a conservative plan for modest recovery from the current activity levels throughout 2021.

There have been highlights throughout the past few months. Aircraft operations from late summer and into the fall at Capital City Executive Airport have actually **exceeded** operations counts for the same months in 2019, and it appears that November will be the busiest month at CXY in 2020 so far. Most of this is local activity, so we believe that flight training is helping drive these numbers up. This is a good sign for the future of the industry. We also completed and opened the parallel taxiway at Franklin County Regional Airport, so it is now possible to taxi to either end of the runway without having to backtaxi. Finally, we welcomed Dan Blouch and DB Services, a new business at Gettysburg Regional Airport. Dan has the fuel farm up and running again and is based in the main hangar. We welcome Dan and look forward to the growth of his business.

At Harrisburg International Airport, commercial passenger activity continues a slow recovery. Fall months have shown some minor increases from the dips of late summer, but we are still averaging about 62 percent below last year's levels. Our forecast for 2021 includes an increase of about 30 percent over the passenger activity of this year, a nice increase, but still well below the average annual activity we usually have.

Capital development is still continuing. The design and permitting for the new aircraft apron at Gettysburg Regional Airport continues forward, with a goal of bidding the project in the spring of 2021, though construction isn't likely until 2022. At Capital City Executive Airport, we will be continuing the design phase of a project to rehabilitate several of the taxiways.

We look forward to 2021 as a year of change. Hopefully changes in the medical world will reduce the impact of the coronavirus, thereby allowing growth in business and opportunities to get together face to face. The comradery of aviation has always made us strong, and we look forward to better times.

We always close with this phrase because it cannot be overstated. Thank you all for your dedication and support of CXY, N68, and W05!! We wish you a great holiday season and look forward to a prosperous new year.
