A Statewide Flying Event!

Since 1991 Wings of Mercy pilots have flown more than 8,000 patient flights for Michigan residents in financial need. We match medical patients who require free air transportation to distant medical facilities with volunteer pilots and aircraft owners, willing to donate their time and aircraft. We are proud to announce a MAJOR flying event: "Wings for Michigan" providing all Michigan pilots an opportunity to fly for a purpose while having a lot of fun visiting designated Michigan Airports who are rolling out the red carpet over the 2 day event.



OUR GOALS:

- Pilots visit as many of Michigan's finest airports as possible
- Wings of Mercy generates enough funding for 50 new patient missions for 2022 (Our average mission cost is \$700)
- Pilots have fun and camaraderie while flying for a purpose

In cooperation with the Michigan Office of Aeronautics and the Michigan Association of Airport Executives this event takes place on September 11 & 12, 2021 and features:

- A statewide tour of up to 15 participating airports where the local airport and community will roll out the Red Carpet for Wings for Michigan volunteers. At many sites you will find coupons for free breakfast, lunches, and other local attractions and "Goodie Bags" at many stops, we plan to have "surprises for your viewing pleasure!"
- All aircraft are welcome: Singles Twins, Turboprops, Homebuilts, Warbirds & Helicopters
- Pilots register online for \$19.91. (The year of our founding) For that you receive Wings for Michigan logo cap & I.D.
- Pilots are encouraged to put together groups of aircraft but of course, single airplanes are welcome.
- Pilots pick their own airports and itinerary. All participating airports will be listed online by September 1.
- This is a 2-day event with attendance at the designated airports between 8:30A and 5:00P. Pilots have the freedom to select the best weather options.
- These flights raise money for this important 30-year aviation charity, for Michigan residents with medical needs.
- Individual and corporate sponsors can easily register their support for you online, by the number of airports visited or a simple lump sum.
- Pilots multiply their online pledges by the number of airports visited, generating "Wings for Michigan" points.
- The top point earners are eligible for some terrific aviation merchandise and products.

Minutes from the 5/20/2021, Board meeting were approved (C. Pagano/Ryden); minutes from the 6/17/2021 Board meeting were approved (B. Haskett/Ryden).

Treasurer's report: Assistant Treasurer Fick reported that all utility bills are paid and all summer taxes have been paid. Accounts still need to be organized and a scholarship account needs to be created. Fick and Treasurer Marks and President Pagano will meet to bring all accounts up to date.

Discussion re: changing banking institutions, change will be made via resolution after new officers are elected in November.

Membership Committee: Chair Ryden reported that current membership stands at 90 members with addition of two new members. Per Ryden's suggestion, a motion to make John Abbott an Honorary Chapter Member was made (McPeak/B. Haskett) and passed. Ryden will notify Mr. Abbott.

Hangar Committee: S. Pagano reported that Lloyd's Door inspected the EAA Annex door re: leaking issues, repair is pending. Lloyd's will order material for FBH lower door seals, Chapter members will install.

Hangars 2A and 7A5 are currently unoccupied.

Door on hangar 7A4 needs to have bearing replaced.

All hangar leases are being updated.

Groundhogs – one has been live-trapped and released off-site, more on-site.

Hangar 7A2 door: waiting until N7131X parts are removed to repair the door.

Young Eagles: Chair Gallant reported Chapter 1093 pilots flew 15 participants on August 14, and 16 participants flew on July 10. There will be no YE flights on September 11 since that is the day of the Chapter's pancake breakfast.

Scholarship Committee: S. Pagano reported Toby Pobanz has been approved by the EAA to be Chapter's 2021 Ray Scholarship recipient.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Cessna 150A disposition: McPeak reported the FAA registration form was corrected and has been re-submitted.

RV-12 build project: S. Pagano reported that build sessions will be held on Wednesdays and Saturdays, schedule will be available on group's Facebook page. EAA insurance will be in place for each session.

Great Lakes Bay Invitational fundraiser: Ryden reported that Chapter 1093 will receive at least \$4,500 for our participation, amount TBD by early September.

Microsoft 2020 Flight Simulator status: C. Pagano reported that the documentation and instructions are posted at device, Ryden will test same and report to Board.

EAA's Eagle Flights: President Pagano reported that Eagle Flights for veterans will be scheduled for November 13 from 1300-1600, sign-up will be online.

EAA Building maintenance: B. Haskett will schedule a work party in October to re-paint the interior walls. Exit signs will be replaced.

The Committee will present a slate of nominees during the October membership meeting; voting will occur during the November membership meeting.
