

EAA 1093 Board Meeting

Minutes May 20, 2021

President Sarah Pagano declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order at 1708 EDT. The Board meeting was held via Zoom.

Directors unable to attend: Chris Pagano, Paul Ries, Dick Sipp, John Sorg

Guest: Dot Hornsby

Minutes from April 15, 2021, Board meeting were approved; motion by Fick/Gallant

Treasurer's report: Treasurer Marks reported that all debit/credit cards have not been received yet from COMERICA, online access to COMERICA accounts is delayed yet again, theoretical scholarship account is not accessible. Marks recommended that the accounts be moved to a different financial institution that will be responsive to our needs.

All bills are paid, deposits made, and reimbursements are complete and up to date with the following account balances as of May 14, 2021:

Fancy Bird House LLC: \$10,439.03

EAA Chapter 1093: \$2,268.36

Clubhouse LLC: \$727.20

2021 Scholarship funds were disbursed from the Chapter account since the Scholarship account is not yet available.

Treasurer requested access to list of tenants/leases for QuickBooks data entry.

Membership Committee report: Chair Ryden reported that current membership stands at 84 members. Delinquent dues payers are contacted bi-monthly.

Hangar Committee report: S. Pagano reported that Lloyd's Door will inspect hangar 7A1 and the EAA Annex re: possible leaking door issues. Don Bonem has received a quote to repair the door to hangar 7A2, his report is expected by/before June Board meeting. S. Pagano to contact all hangar tenants to update leases, information to be shared with Treasurer.

Young Eagles report: Chair Gallant reported May YE flights were cancelled due to pandemic restrictions.

June 12 is National Young Eagles Day, and Chapter 1093 is taking online registration for flights. Gallant called for volunteers (pilots, ground crew) for the event which will be held in the EAA building.

Scholarship Committee report: S. Pagano reported that 2020 Ray Scholarship recipient Daniel Libby passed his check ride and received his Private Pilot license. The Committee has identified a potential nominee for a 2021 Ray Scholarship; six Chapter scholarships for 2021 were announced at the May 1 pancake breakfast.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Cessna 150A disposition: McPeak reported FAA returned the registration form for corrections, S. Pagano and McPeak will make corrections and re-submit form.

RV-12 build project: S. Pagano reported that the initial build meeting will be held in the EAA Annex on June 5 at 11:30, following the membership meeting.

Great Lakes Bay Invitational fundraiser: Ryden reported that details on how the Chapter can

participate in the July 11-17 event are forthcoming.

Pancake Breakfast: President Pagano reported that the drive-thru pancake breakfast on Saturday, May 1, was a qualified success. Net gain (<\$1,000) was less than traditional event, number of meals (371) was about half of usual number, but volunteers/customers unanimously agreed that it was worth the effort.

Microsoft 2020 Flight Simulator status: Tom Ryden will 'test' the documentation and instructions next week.

EAA's Eagle Flights: President Pagano reported that Eagle Flights may be scheduled for July and/or August if the COVID-19 case numbers are down.

NEW BUSINESS:

Return to in-person meetings: The June membership meeting will be on Saturday, June 5, at 10:00 a.m., with a program featuring an aviation attorney. The meeting will be held in the EAA classroom for both in-person attendance and with a Zoom meeting set-up.

On Thursday, June 17, the Board meeting will also be a hybrid with both in-person attendance and Zoom attendance.

President S. Pagano adjourned the meeting at 1800 EDT.

CDT **Qualifies for FAA WINGS credit.**

Mike Hudetz, FAA weight-shift CFI and DPE, will discuss the modern trike development from the earliest aviation experiments dating back to 1891. He will explain performance and flight characteristics, including how the flexwing trike is different from a fixed-wing airplane, including how airplane pilots can transition and add weight-shift privileges.

6/15/21 7 p.m. [Decision-Making and Loss of Control Inflight \(LOC-I\)](#) Gordon Penner
CDT **Qualifies for FAA WINGS credit.**

Gordon Penner will take a big-picture look at LOC-I and decision-making. Elements of the talk will include: a discussion of the takeoff phase from the beginning of the takeoff roll to the point where a safe return altitude is reached; a look at LOC-I when trying to return to the runway after engine failure and ways to determine a safe return altitude; risks for LOC-I in the maneuvering, approach, and landing phases, and finally botched go-arounds.

This webinar will provide a high-level overview of various tax issues applicable to general aviation aircraft and hangars. Mark Spang will discuss the NOTAM arrival and departure procedures specific to the grass runway on the south end of the airport used by ultralights/lightplanes and homebuilt rotorcraft.
