#### **Ed Yonkers**

Edward H. Yonkers, 97, a devoted and beloved husband, father, grandfather, and greatgrandfather, passed away in Solon, Ohio on February 14, 2022. A Midland resident for over seven decades, Yonkers was a member of the Greatest Generation and took enormous pride in his military service for the country during World War II. He was stationed at an airbase in England and received numerous decorations for his service. Born in Kent, Ohio on September 29, 1924, Yonkers moved to Midland in 1950 and worked as a respected scientist for Dow Chemical for over forty years. Yonkers possessed a skill set that was rarely seen in his day and is virtually non-existent now. In addition to his scientific credentials, he was a master wood worker, carpenter, plumber, and electrician. Yonkers built his own house as well as several airplanes and the Barstow hangar he kept them in. There was no job he would not tackle, and, as a proud member of Midland Kiwanis, he worked on numerous public service construction projects, mostly for children. A Renaissance man, he also enjoyed square dancing, international travel, domestic trips in his Airstream trailer, and cooking. Yonkers was married twice, first to Jane Yonkers and, after her death, to the former Julia Aamoth, who passed away in 2012. He is survived by two step-sons, their wives, and their four children, who knew him as "Grandpa," as well as five nieces and their extended families. His ashes will be interred in the Shrader Memorial Garden at the First United Methodist Church where he was a member since his arrival in Midland. Donations in his memory may be made to the youth ministries of the First United Methodist Church.

Come see the aircraft on display while you enjoy all-you-can-eat pancakes, sausage, eggs, and our famous homemade doughnuts.


Kids will enjoy pedal airplanes as well as activities at the kids' table.

# EAA 1093 Chapter Membership Meeting Notes March 5, 2022

President Sarah Pagano called the meeting to order at 1009 EST.

President Pagano presented Chapter Service Awards to 2021 Officers.

Membership Chair Sarah Haskett presented gold 10 year membership badges to Marty Winslow and John McPeak.

Scholarship Committee Chair Jim Murphy presented an update on the current Ray Scholars. The Chapter has an opportunity to award another Ray Scholarship in 2022, Murphy requested that information re: a potential candidate be sent to him. For the Ray Scholarship, candidates do not apply, a Chapter member needs to nominate the potential candidate. Murphy also requested applications and references for potential Chapter scholarship candidates.

President Pagano presented information re: the donation of hangar 3J and contents to the Chapter and possible scenarios for the use/disposal of the donation.

Hangar is 40' x 50' (2,000 sq. ft.), full concrete floor, insulated, heated,  $\frac{1}{2}$  bathroom, 10' x 38' bifold door, small loft area. Cost of ownership is  $\frac{3}{600}$ , utilities included,  $\frac{2}{600}$ , utilities excluded.

Contents: 2 Continental W670 radial engines; Little Toot home-built project; Starduster home-built project; table saw; planer; snow blower; gas caddy; shop vacuum; miscellaneous shop tools.

Contents will be catalogued, valued, and offered for sale.

Hangar could be sold, rented, or used for Chapter activities.

A survey will be sent to all Chapter members soliciting input re: how best to use the donation. The Chapter Board will use the survey results to help decide how the donation will be used.

There were 22 attendees in the EAA classroom, 21 Chapter members plus 1 guest.

Meeting adjourned at 1045 EST.

Refreshments were provided for all attendees.

March 17, 2022

President Sarah Pagano called the meeting to order at 1708 EDT. The Board meeting was held in-person in the Annex and with Zoom.

Minutes from the February 17, 2022, Board meeting were approved (Fick/C. Pagano).

Treasurer's report: Treasurer Fick reported that \$2,245 was moved into the Chapter's scholar-ship account. Lease payments of \$6,609 are due in 2022.

MFCU checking account balances as of February 17, 2022:

Fancy Bird House LLC: \$6,540.73

EAA Chapter 1093: \$3,957.00

Clubhouse LLC: \$ 573.00

Total in checking and savings accounts ~\$50,000

Membership Committee: S. Pagano reported that current membership is 109, five new members since 1/1/2022.

Hangar Committee: S. Pagano reported that Michigan Door will re-inspect EAA Annex door, and will provide a quote to repair the door to hangar 2A.

Young Eagles: No Young Eagles were flown on March due to marginal weather.

Scholarship Committee: Applications for Chapter scholarships are due by March 31 for review and approval in April (forms are online).

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

RV-12 build project: S. Pagano reported that a 'crate date' has been received for the wings kit, between 5/20 and 6/17.

The fuselage kit has been ordered, delivery is expected in late 2022.

Great Lakes Bay Invitational fundraiser: Ryden reported that the application for the 2022 event has been made, successful applicants will be announced in May for July event.

EAA's Eagle Flights: S. Pagano reported that an Eagle Flights event (for Veterans) is being planned for fall, tentatively 10/1. Plans are being made for also providing a meal for the participants, plus a fund-raiser.

No Learn to Fly day(s) are planned for 2022 due to interference with the Rusty Pilots Seminar on 5/21 and the inclusion of the October Eagle Flights for Veterans in the Chapter's schedule of events.

- Aviation Camp: S. Pagano reported that Aviation Camp 2022 registrations are being accepted for the June 13-17 Camp.
- Rusty Pilot Seminar: AOPA will present a seminar on 5/21/22 in the Chapter's classroom, Chapter will have local CFIs available. Participants need to register online (https://pic.aopa.org/events/item/52/3556).
- MPS 'Flight Night': Plymouth Elementary School is presenting an event for their third graders on 4/29. S. Pagano is still looking for pilot volunteers to 'man' educational stations from 5:30 7:30, also need pilots/planes to fly the pattern during the event and some aircraft to be parked on the apron; see Sarah Pagano to volunteer.
- Hangar 3J donation: S. Pagano has appointed Dave Fick, Joe Maj, and John McPeak as a committee to catalog the contents of hangar 3J, determine a value for each item, and report to the Board re: possible avenues to sell the contents.
- The results of a survey of the membership asking for input on renting/selling the hangar were discussed, the Board wants to know what the appraised value of the hangar is before continuing the discussion. S. Pagano will send a copy of the appraisal to the Board members.
- Fly-Outs: S. Pagano is working on scheduling 'official' fly-outs on the Chapter's events schedule, more information will be included in Lookin' Up.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

May Pancake Breakfast: S. Pagano reported that Chapter will present an in-person pancake breakfast on Saturday, May 7, COVID conditions permitting. Plan 'B' will be a takeout breakfast similar to last May, if necessary.

Following discussion, the decision was to keep the fees at \$7 for an adult and \$3 for a child.

There is a need for volunteers experienced in the donut-making process: a training session will be held on Saturday, April 2, following the monthly membership meeting.

President Pagano adjourned the meeting at 1756 EDT.
