FROM YOUR PRESIDENT:

It is good practice, and we never know when we will get caught in a cross wind. So, be safe and be prepared, and watch the Kansas weather.

For those that missed last month, you missed a great program. Mr. Olson had some great information on engines, and how best to take care of them. I am not sure what our VP has in mind for this month, but I know it will be good. Also, this month we will make final preparations for our fly-in to be held August 5, pancakes will be ready by 0700. Let's hope for a nice cool calm day, it doesn't hurt to hope. We will discuss when we do the airport clean up at the meeting, but if we do as in the past it would be Wednesday August 3. We will talk about that and see how it fits everyone's schedule. Also, we don't expect our out of Ellsworth members to drive here just for clean-up although our local members are fewer, our airport board also helps out so we will be alright.

We also need to look a bit further ahead as our annual Young Eagles Day is not that far after the fly in. Looks like this year would be November 4. The election of officers is in October, and I will appoint a nominating committee at our August meeting which will follow the fly-in on August 5. Still working on our airport, mostly just miscellaneous things, but still things that need done. We will need to put markings on 13/31 prior to opening it. We are hoping that it will be open by April 2024, which is when the NOTAM expires, but with good luck and rain we may make it before that. Also, our new AWOS system is on the books maybe in September. So, a lot is going on, but it is good. We continue to get comments on our runway and crooked exit, Alpha1. I did have to put my mechanic hat on recently and install a new CHT on the old Skyhawk. Not a tough job, but I am slow, so it took a while. But also, a good time to look everything over following the recent annual. I noticed the problem recently on one of my short around the county flights when I looked at the CHT and it was reading 150deg. A bit low, pulled the prop through and all felt good so ordered a new gauge and sensor and that seems to have corrected the problem. At least that is better than a bad cylinder.

Well, that's about it for this month. Hope you are flying; mornings are best, the nice cool air of summer. First thing in the morning is a good way to look things over and see how the countryside is looking. It also keeps us older pilots current, and practice never hurts. So, keep flying, be safe, and see you at the July meeting.
