After your information is submitted, verification takes no more than 10 business days. So if you haven't yet registered, go to your account at eaa.org and click on Training in time to complete it before April 21.

"So a Person Walks Into . . . "

So, a person walks into an airport and wants to help with Young Eagles . . . Let this be you so you can finish your own story!

The Young Eagles program has dedicated over 25 years to giving youth ages 8–17 their first free ride in an airplane. It is the only program of its kind, with the sole mission to introduce and inspire kids in the world of aviation. Today, the Young Eagles program has flown over 2 million kids with the help of EAA's network of volunteer pilots and ground volunteers. It is honor to report that EAA 113 has performed 3,139 Young Eagle flights!!

We will be hosting four Young Eagle rallies this year: April 21st, May 19th, September 22nd and October 20th from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. These events are open to the public and therefore, not limited to specific groups. Because of this "open" status, we will not have any advance indication on a number that are expected to attend. We want to plan for the BEST case scenario, which would be a very busy day with *many* young people; which only means that to make the day successful, we need *many* volunteers!!

There are positions available for everyone to volunteer. WE NEED YOUR HELP!! Duties include:

1.) Pilots

To fly passengers in the EAA Young Eagles® program, you must:

- Be an EAA member.
- Complete the EAA Youth Protection Policy, which includes a short training session and background check.
- Have a valid airman's certificate (sport pilot or greater).
- Possess a current medical certificate or BasicMed (if applicable).
- Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use.
- Have a current biennial flight review.
- Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition.
- Have Aircraft Passenger Liability Insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed).
- Adhere to all applicable Federal Aviation Regulations.

If you have not previously flown with our Chapter, please contact Dave James, our Young Eagle Pilot Coordinator for details.

2). Ground Support

- a). **Pilot Assistants** to help the Young Eagle walk safely out to the airplane, assist with getting them buckled in properly and doors secured, and then walk them back to the hangar upon their return. We need ONE volunteer for every pilot!!
- b). **Public Relations Specialists**-to simply talk to the parents and answer questions and promote aviation and EAA 113.
- c). **Registration**-to assist with the processing of each registration form to ensure the child is of the correct age and answer questions.
- d). **Security**-to ensure the young people are behaving in a safe manner and that the parents have not wandered off in areas they should not be. Crowd Control, if you will.

All jobs at Young Eagles are important and we simply can NOT have these events without adequate help from many volunteers. There truly is a job to suit everyone: jobs that require lots of walking to click off those steps on your Fitbit to jobs that require simply standing around and talking to visitors. Those volunteers with Cat Herding skills are greatly appreciated!

The duties are not difficult and require little training. The only requirement set forth by EAA, is that volunteers go through the Youth Protection Program. The training is intended to teach the "best practices" for protection of both the youth and our volunteers. The process should give peace of mind to parents and guardians of children participating in Young Eagles. It is similar to the standards established in other youth programs throughout the county. The online training is available at the bottom of the welcome page by logging into www.eaa.org where the presentation will typically take about 15 minutes. After the information is submitted for the background check, you can expect verification to take no more than 10 business days. If you have not already done this Youth Protection Training, please do that now, so you will have your confirmation prior to the event.

PLEASE let me know if you are available on April 21st to help with this first Young Eagle Rally. Volunteers are asked to be here by 7:30 a.m. for a brief meeting and job assignments and let's not forget the coffee and bagels/doughnuts. Please arrive early.... It is difficult to start processing Young Eagles and Volunteers at the same time. We could be very busy, as a couple of the school groups that we generally did separately in the past, have said they might come out.

We hope that you will make these Young Eagle events a priority on your calendar. The commitment of time is small but the reward will be huge! Each Young Eagle will gain an understanding that their potential is unlimited and for them, the sky is the limit!! Help share the Spirit of Aviation!




