
“EAA Chapter 113’s major focus is on the relationships with people who have diverse aviation interests, centered around their love of flight, fellowship, learning, and fun.”


Mettetal Airport For Sale?



The VAA Chapter has their own building, a former maintenance hangar, at the DeKalb County Airport (GWB). Inside the hangar they've built a fabulous Chapter House with a fully equipped kitchen, lounge, seating from a restaurant for enjoying pancakes, and very cool aviation decorations everywhere. The hangar has room to work on at least three projects.


At breakfast we sat across from a couple from Los Alamos, New Mexico, who were there visiting relatives. The guy is an engineer at the Los Alamos National Laboratory. He said he had a hand in designing and building five different spacecraft that are currently in orbit. He flies a beautiful Tri-Pacer that he restored himself. And he recently completed an Arion Lightning, a sleek low-wing composite two-seater. Elevation at his home airport is 7,171 ft -- talk about density altitude!

All in all, a very enjoyable experience on a perfect VFR summer day. A nice place, and really, really nice people, very happy to have us visit. And the scrambled eggs were great!

Randy loves it, but says he can't justify another airplane.






