

#### CHAPTER 113 MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN A FIRST RESPONDER'S TRAINING SESSION

On Saturday, July 13, 2024, chapter members: Jim Brown with his Commanche 180; Rick Karaschin with his Rans; and myself with a Bell 47, participated in a training seminar. The FAA set everything up at Willow Run to work with the Belleville Fire Department first responders. Our task was to educate the fire department on how to deal with a general aviation aircraft off airport event. We had numerous different aircraft available from light sport with a ballistic chute, a Piper Seneca, and a helicopter. We explained how to shut down a running aircraft engine, disable the electrical system, taught them where to identify fuel is located, and how to verify the aircraft is stabilized to be able to work around if people need to be removed by first responders. Everyone had a great afternoon and the fire department was grateful. The FAA is wanting to do this on an annual basis, expanding to other departments in our area.




