Congratulations on your decision to apply for our flight training scholarship!

Acquiring a pilot's certificate is a privilege that requires commitment, dedicated study, perseverance, and a willingness to learn. This endeavor should not be taken lightly, but the process will be very rewarding and will, in many ways, change your life.

The following Flight Training Scholarship opportunities are currently available for students ages 15 to 19. The maximum scholarship award amount varies with the type of pilot certificate sought:

Glider Pilot (15-19) Light Sport Pilot (16-19) Private Pilot (16-19) \$6,000 \$9,000 \$12,000

Flight training is tailored to individual abilities. It is possible the selected certificate can be completed at a cost below the award limits. However, it is also possible that training completion may require additional funds be provided by the applicant.

If awarded a scholarship, EAA International and Aim for the Sky Fund will provide funds to EAA Chapter 122 to administer on behalf of the student pilot. Continued funding is dependent upon the scholar completing progress reports and meeting training milestones in a timely manner. The scholar will have 60 days following award notification to choose a flight training school / instructor and complete the first training flight, three months to complete the first solo, six months to complete the FAA written exam, and one year to take the FAA Practical Exam (check ride). The scholar will commit to a minimum of two volunteer hours per month for the local EAA chapter. A third class medical certificate is required for Private Pilot scholars *prior* to training. If selected for the scholarship, a local EAA member will help you understand and complete these requirements.

All applicants may be subject to additional information requests, if needed to support the EAA selection process.
