
What is an Aviation Poker Run?



Final Flight Notes: Prioritizing Precision in Flight

Checklist Discipline: Follow It Every Time

Even the most experienced pilots can overlook details if they get complacent. Always follow your preflight, takeoff, cruise, and landing checklists—no shortcuts. A disciplined approach to checklists ensures no critical step is missed and builds good habits for every flight.

Fuel Awareness: Plan for the Unexpected

Never assume fuel calculations will be exact. Factors like headwinds, altitude changes, and delays can alter your burn rate. Always verify your fuel quantity before takeoff and have a clear alternate plan if conditions change. A good rule of thumb? Land with more than just minimum reserves.

See and Be Seen: Collision Avoidance Matters

As the skies get busier, maintaining traffic awareness is more important than ever. Keep your head on a swivel, scan for other aircraft, use ADS-B if available, and communicate position reports in uncontrolled airspace. Assume someone may not see you—extra vigilance can prevent a close call.

Get in the Habit of Personal Minimums

It's easy to be confident in fair conditions, but when faced with low visibility, gusty crosswinds, or marginal ceilings, your personal minimums matter more than regulations. Set realistic limits based on your skills, experience, and comfort level, and stick to them—don't let "get-there-itis" influence your decisions.

Spring Weather: Expect the Unexpected

As we move into the spring months, rapidly changing weather patterns become a factor. Strong winds, pop-up thunderstorms, and shifting temperatures can make for challenging flights. Stay ahead of the weather with thorough preflight briefings and in-flight monitoring, and don't hesitate to alter your plans when needed.
